## Biennial Report

The ABC Biennial/Mission Summit was held June 30-July 2 in Portland, Oregon. Jere Maddux, Beth Douglass, and Dave and Susan Russell attended from our church. American Baptists are said to be the most diverse Protestant denomination, and that diversity really shows at the biennial. Through times of worship especially, we experienced the variety of cultures and traditions that makes up our American Baptist family and were reminded that such diversity mirrors the full image of God. We celebrated as Josue Gomez-Menedez was elected as the first president of the denomination from Puerto Rico.



Pastor Dave was part of a pre-biennial event, "American Baptists Bike," which highlighted wellness and care for the environment. The plan was to set the record for largest number of clergy on bicycles. (Since the record is not listed in Guinness, this would be the new record.) The count was reported to be "greater than 50 and less than a thousand."



## Parkinson's Disease Choir Festival

The Singing Festival was planned by Dr. Elizabeth Stegemoller.
