So, I made up a bunch of flyers, mailed one to every Pepsi collector I knew or had heard about inviting them to a meeting. To say I was disappointed would be an understatement. At this point there was some doubt as to whether there was enough interest in a club for Pepsi collectors. Starla Overstreet of Roanake Virginia passed along this recipe that she ran across.

THE UH-HUH! CAKE

2 cups all-purpose flour

2 cups granulated sugar

2 sticks butter, melted

2 Tbsps. unsweetened cocoa

1 cup Pepsi (it should be fizzy, no diet)

1/2 cup buttermilk

2 eggs, beaten

1 tsp soda

1 tsp vanilla extract

1 1/2 cups miniature

marshmallows

6 Tbsps softened butter

1 cup dark brown sugar

2/3 cup smooth peanut butter

1/4 cup milk

2/3 chopped peanuts

In large bowl, combine flour & sugar. Separately, combine melted butter, cocoa and Pepsi; pour over flour and sugar and stir until well blended. Add buttermilk, eggs, soda and vanilla; mix well. Stir in marshmallows. Pour into greased and floured 13x9x2-in. pan. Bake in 350 degree oven for 40 minutes.

Meanwhile cream softened butter, brown sugar, and peanut butter. Beat in milk, then fold in nuts. Spread over cake as soon as it's removed from the oven. Put cake under the broiler, 4 inches from source of heat, until topping begins to bubble. Watch carefully. Cool on wire rack for 30 minutes. Serve from pan.

CYCLAMATE BOTTLES BY SCOTT & KIM KINZIE

We all love the "You've Got The Right One" campaign for Diet Pepsi, it stands number 1 in advertising slogans.

For 65 years the Pepsi-Cola Company was first introduced in 1964, it's first advertising stood along side Pepsi-Cola. In 1968 the girl watchers campaign gave Diet Pepsi an identity of it's own, and the teme music soon became a top 40's hit.

Deit Pepsi was first sweetened with calcium cyclamate and sacharin. Cyclamate is 30 to 80 percent as sweet as sugar and was widely used. In October 1969 the Food & Drug Admininstration removed cyclamate from its list of approved food additives because of a question of safety. In 1977 saccarine also came under fire, but the ban was blocked by the F.D.A. for soft drink use in 1983 and in 1984 Diet Pepsi was reformulated to use the new sweetner.

Instead of throwing out the Diet Pepsi bottles marked with the cyclamate ingredient they were browned out and reprinted with Pepsi-Cola. That unusual looking pepsi bottle with brown around the top and bottom is actually a unique Diet Pepsi collectable in disguise.



It's really amazing that 1 purchase at a flea market could lead you to make so many friends across the country. Learn so much about the history of great advertising. The search goes on!









COLLECTORS INFORMATION

In an attempt to keep our members on the cutting edge of Pepsi-Cola nouveau cuisine, the following is another recipe for using Pepsi for something besides drinking!

JANA'S PEPSI CHICKEN

1 Fryer chicken, 2-1/2 - 3 Lbs., cut up 2 cups ketchup 16 ounces Pepsi Garnish: sprigs of fresh parsley

Preliminaries: Preheat oven to 400 degrees.

Procedure: Place chicken in 9 by 13" baking pan. Pour ketchup evenly over chicken. Sprinkle Pepsi over ketchup.
Bake in preheated 400-degree oven, uncovered, for 45 minutes to 1 hour. Turn chicken occasionally and add more Pepsi if sauce gets too thick.

PINK PEPSI BOTTLES

Have you ever seen Pink Pepsi bottles? If you were at Pepsi-Fest '91 and '92, you probably did. There is an interesting story about them that I would like to share with you.

There are 30 of these bottles in 3 different patterns. They were produced in December, 1953 and January 1954 for Pepsi-Cola by Wheaton Glass in Millville, N.J. which is a cosmetic and pharmaceutical bottle producer.

As these bottles were produced it was discovered that the pink glass clashed horribly with the color of Pepsi so the project was dropped.


An employee of Wheaton Glass came upon these bottles in the trash as a storeroom was being cleaned in 1960. He asked the manager of the department at the time about the bottles and was told he could have them. At that time he was told about the failure of the project and the color clash.

The bottles were packed away for over 31 years, and just recently became available for collectors.

The equipment, mold and drawing order, that was recently acquired from T.C. Wheaton Co., from Pepsi-Cola specifies round fluted 6oz. cola bottles. The order specifications and a model design are shown. A lot of emphasis was placed on fluting and light reflection in the design of these bottles at that time. One of the final products is also shown.

I have 2 of these bottles, a spiral and the crown pattern, and in my opinion, their quality, character and geometric are superior to any of the standard Pepsi bottle designs. In fact, the spiral design could have been a model for making a mold for the standard 1958 spiral design. To my knowledge, these are the first known spiral bottles. The similarity to the 6oz. spiral bottle is very apparent.

I've never seen another soda bottle, Pepsi or otherwise, come close to these in beauty and character. I'm happy to have 2 in my collection.

Approximately 120 bidders and 25 absentee bidders from 23 states participated at the auction of the Everette Lloyd Pepsi-Cola collection, Saturday November 14th in Roanoke, Virginia.

Some of the highlights from the auction were as follows: 1907 heavy cardboard poster girl holding a glass (the American beverage) the only one known to exist in this size sold for \$8500.00; a 1909 4 sided tin straw holder featuring Gibson Girl graphics on every side brought \$7500.00; 6 inch round blue and white Pepsin drink tip tray realized a selling price of \$2700.00; 1905 paper hand fan with rattan handle picturing child with glass on one side and straight sided bottle on reverse sold for \$1350.00; 1905 decorated china syrup dispenser one of a few known to exist realized a price of \$6500.00; 1908 self framed oval tin sign probably the best of only a few known to exist sold for \$4500.00; an early 1900's syrup back bar bottle applied label with gold leaf and original cap brought a price of \$1450.00

There was over 700 lots consisting of signs, cardboards, calendars, miscellaneous and box lots in all price ranges. Prices listed do not include a 10% buyers premium and sales tax.

The auction was very well organized and professionally conducted by Gary Metz and Richard Opfer. It was a pleasure to attend.




