

V. THE FAITH / CHARACTER BASED HONOR DORM PROGRAM

In this past year, the A.D.O.C. has been renovating the prison dorms here at Bullock Correctional Facility. As a result, the permanent Faith / Character Based Honor dorm was relocated temporarily to the C – Dorm area. Our number of bed spaces was greatly reduced from 104 to 64 and several of the men had to leave the Faith / Character dorm unwillingly. The construction continues as of this writing, and at this point, there is not an official dorm assigned as the Faith / Character dorm. We are looking forward to being assigned a new Faith / Character Based Honor dorm when the construction is completed.

VI. RE-ENTRY PROGRAMS

We have several ministries that have prepared residential housing and job assistance to inmates who are either being paroled or ending their sentence time. These ministries are vital to helping men and women in the process of merging back with society again to prepare residential housing, employment, mental health services, and rehabilitation programs. We are grateful for their compassion for our inmates and ask that you pray for them as they continue their kingdom work.

VIII. MINISTRY DEVELOPMENTS

As you know, Rev. Frank Gossett and his wife, Kathryn, joined our staff as Assistant Chaplains through the *We Care* ministries last year in 2017. Since that time, Chaplain Gossett has been an excellent addition to our staff. He opens the Chapel for us several days throughout the week as well as teaching some of our classes for Liberty Theological Seminaries, Int'l.

Chaplain Gossett is employed through the *We Care* ministries and receives his full-time salary through them. This salary is paid to him out of his personal account through *We Care Ministries* and he alone is responsible for raising the monies that go into that account.

Due to some hardships that have occurred to most his regular supporters, Chaplain Gossett does not have regular financial support being raised to his *We Care Ministries* account. This means that he does not receive a salary if he has not been able to raise funds for his account.
