

Notorious Ambitious Leadership In World History

All these leader's listed had a form of cultism movements in their leadership to gain honor or power in political and public arenas':

1. Adolf Hitler, leader of Nazi Germany, "Genocide Movement" known as the Holocaust. His agenda led to World War II and Hitler was responsible for the deaths of 11 million people which included six million Jews. His reign 1933 to 1945.
2. Idi Amin, Uganda military officer, who became President of Uganda in 1971 by overthrowing the current President with his military power. Known as "Butcher of Uganda Movement" in which he killed 100,000 of his opponents for power and ate their flesh. His reign 1971 to 1979.
3. Jim Jones, American Pentecost cult leader preacher, self-professed faith healer, and civil rights activist, known as "The Prophet Movement of Power," People's Temple, based out of the Bay Area—San Francisco. He conspired with his inner circle to direct a massacre murder-suicide of himself and his followers in his jungle commune at Jonestown, Guyana on November 18, 1978. His ambition for power murdered over 900 predominantly Black-African America people including approximately 276 children by a lethal Kool-aid poisoning drink. His reign 1955 to 1978.
4. Kenneth Lay and Jeffrey Skilling, CEO's dual power. The Enron Corporate Scandal, American Energy Company, The Wall Street's "America's Most Innovative Company" based in Houston, Texas. The ambitious CEO's were convicted in the world's largest history making accounting fraud of billions of dollars, security exchange, inside trading, and conspiracy to erode lifesavings of selected employees. The corporate culture "Do It Right, Do It Now, and Do It Better Movement" without ethical boundaries. Their reign 1985 to 2002.
