Missions

The Missions Committee hosted the annual Haitian Benefit Luncheon by which, for thirty years, we have supported the Haitian Health Foundation's "Save A Family" program. Marilyn Lowney, daughter of founders Dr. and Ms. Lowney, gave an energetic presentation of the Foundation's work in the remote Haitian western peninsula. Marilyn told us how her father was convinced to open the clinic at the insistence of Mother Theresa. As a child, Marilyn remembers being told to get off the phone with her friends because Mother Theresa was going to be calling. The luncheon included plantains, traditional rice and beans and two rum cakes. We raised \$300 for the family we support.

Much of our mission work is being done collaboratively with other faith communities through KBIC. Our part in the Warm Hearts Warm Concert helped to raise \$1872 for the Fuel Bank at a recent Saturday night concert/silent auction at Westfield Church. David, our choir and Real Carpentier were well appreciated.

The Thrift Shoppe is inviting more volunteers to help the effort that expands our mission while supporting the bottom line. Looking forward to the Spring yard sale on May 7th, we need volunteers to help sort through the accumulating items in the Thrift Shoppe garage. If you've been part of the Federated Church for a while,

you learn that when we lose certain, key people, we come to realize how significant their role was. Some crucial piece isn't handled because Ruth, or Sue or Roland wasn't there to take care of it. Val Craig was one of those people, and her role, regularly sorting through and repurposing donations is really missed. Speak to Diane or Earl if you can help sort between now and the yard sale in May.

Twice a year the Haitian Health Foundation sends a trailer full of needed items to Haiti. The next shipment heads down on April 16th. Between now and then we will be collecting cans of tuna fish (packed in oil) peanut butter (smooth) bar soap and toiletries and suitcases to include in the shipment.

Kid's Care Project

St. John's Lutheran will host the Kids' Care meal packaging project On Sunday, April 3rd at St. John's new home on Route 12 south of Danielson at 190 Wauregan Road. Beginning at 11:00 am, five processing lines will package tens of thousands of meals for Eastern Connecticut food pantries and shelters.

Our Joyous Noise collection through Lent is helping to purchase the product (pasta and tomato basil). At 25 cents a meal, enough has been raised to package over 37,000 meals.

W.C.G.C.S.

The Women's Group met on March 7th to finalize plans for the March 19th Lasagna Take Out Dinner. As usual we will be making 120 vegetarian and meat lasagna dinners. Many thanks to our bakers who supply the cakes and to our patrons who faithfully show up to buy lasagna.

The Department of Health has inspected the church kitchen and given it a grade of 98%. (One cupboard needs cleaning and a new receptacle for silverware). Thanks to the staff of the Village Green and the Coffee Hour helpers for keeping the kitchen in good order. Our Approved Kitchen certificate for 2016 has been posted.

Hannah reported that in the past month, W.C.G.C.S has contributed \$100 each to the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Project Access, Community Kitchen, Silver Lake, Camp Wightman and the UCC Wider Church Mission. In March we will be contributing to the Discretionary Fund and making our quarterly pledge to the church budget.

Our next meeting will be on April 11th at 1 PM in the Chapel meeting room and we will be organizing the Mother's Day Plant Sale on May 7th.

Hymn Deconstruction

Next time you sing a hymn, look at the footnotes. What may surprise you is that often the lyrics and music come from two different sources. Let's look at "Jesus, the Very Thought of Thee," also known as "Jesus, Thou Joy of Loving Hearts."

Based on "Jesu Dulcis Memoria" it is believed this was written by Saint Bernard of Clairvaux. He lived from 1090 to 1153 in Clairvaux, France; and was canonized as a Saint 1/18/1174, by Pope Alexander III.

You might think, he must've spoken French, or Latin; how did that translate so perfectly to rhyme? In Latin the original reads as follows:

The sweet memory of Jesus Giving true joy to the heart, But more than honey and all things His sweet presence. *Nothing more delightful is sung, Nothing more pleasing heard, Nothing sweeter thought*, Than Jesus, the Son of God. O Jesus, hope of the penitent, How gracious you are to those who ask How good to those who see you; But what [are you] to those who find? No tongue may tell, *No letter express;* He who has experience of it can believe What it is to love Jesus. O Jesus, may you be our joy, You who are our future reward. May our glory be in you Throughout all eternity.

...but talented translators like Edward Caswall did it in 1849.
