

Golden Ragwort



This carefree Native groundcover blooms well in sun or shade. *Packera* are a larval host for 18 species of butterflies and moths. They are also an important food source for pollinators. Happiest in a shady area, if placed in full sun be sure there is adequate moisture. Golden Ragwort has a lot to offer including evergreen leaves in mild winters. This plant has been used traditionally for medicinal purposes.
