

BIEROCK CASSEROLE

1 (8 oz.) Bag Shredded Cheddar Cheese

2 Packages Crescent Rolls (8 Count each)

I Lb. Ground Beef

1 Onion finely chopped

½ Lg. Package of Shredded Cabbage

Garlic Salt (or fresh garlic minced)

Onion Salt (to your taste)

Seasoning Salt (to your taste)

Black Pepper (to your taste)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Brown Gr. Beef, onion & Cabbage. drain grease. Season w/Salt/pepper & minced garlic if using instead of garlic salt., Line 10 X13" Pan with one package of one package of crescent rolls. Layer beef mixture on top and add cheese, arrange second package of crescent rolls flattened and laid on top.

Bake for 20 min covered with foil.

Then bake another 10 min uncovered. (Re-heats well)
