

### St. Bernard Food Pantry

The St. Bernard Food Pantry would like to thank you for your past support. We would ask your continued assistance to support our Mission to serve the needy.

- First and foremost, please encourage those who may need assistance. We handle the ordinary food assistance program, the senior program, and the produce and emergency food assistance. The guidelines are fairly simple. Eligibility forms may be found near the entrances to the Church.
- Please continue whatever monetary, food assistance and volunteer efforts you are presently doing.
- Please consider doing a special food of the month donation. Food of the month requests for the next three months are: March—Jell-O/pudding; April— Condiments (ketchup, mustard, mayo, salad dressing, etc.); May—Baked beans, kidney beans, black beans (not green beans).
- Produce to People program provides individuals and families with 30 to 50 pounds of food consisting mostly of fresh produce. Qualifications: Earn income within 150 percent of the poverty outline; Receive other social services like Medicare, Social Security, unemployment, free or reduced price school lunches; Have a temporary emergency condition (fire, loss of power or job loss, etc.) You do not need to bring any proof of income, documentation or identification to receive food. Registration takes place at every distribution. Distribution dates: Mar 27, Apr 24, May 22 and Jun 26 at St. Bernard Food Pantry 139 Huber St., Hastings from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.
