1. Mayor Scott Mitchell called the Council Meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

Roll Call: Matthias, Bebee, Byers, Johnston,

Also present: Deputy Dan Luesebrink; Matt Scheer; Gerri Crook; Mark Nahra-Woodbury County Engineer; Cliff Teel-Public Works; Lori Teel-City Clerk.

**Public Hearing** – Motion by Matthias, second by Bebee to open the Public Hearing. All ayes... MC  
Mayor Mitchell opened the Public Hearing at 7:10 p.m. **this was a Public Hearing on Proposed FY21-22 City of Hornick Budget Amendment.** No citizens voiced an opinion for or against the proposal. No oral or written comments were ever received after the required notice was published in the Sioux City Journal, posted on the website and posted in Hornick. Motion by Byers, second by Matthias to close the Public Hearing.

d. Woodbury County Main Street Project – County Engineer Mark Nahra presented and explained the proposed agreement between Woodbury County and the City of Hornick for project STBG-SWAP-CO97(142)—FG-97 which includes improvements to Hornick’s Main Street. Johnston made a motion and Byers seconded to approve the Agreement between Woodbury County and the City of Hornick regarding the Project STBG-SWAP-CO97(142)—FG-97 with the city contribution for work within the City estimated to be \$115,451.00 less federal aid funding of \$54,205.94 leaving an estimated cost of \$61,245.06 to be repaid to the County over a period of 10 years with no interest charged to the City and to authorize the mayor and clerk to execute the agreement. No further discussion. Four (4) ayes. One (1) absent. Roll Call Vote – Matthias (aye), Byers (aye), Bebee (aye), Johnston (aye), Andresen (absent)...MC.

f. City Code of Ordinances – Council discussed the need to have the Ordinances updated to allow for enforcement of Codes. Clerk to ask SIMPCO to present Council with options at the June meeting.

c. Byers made a motion and Johnston seconded to approve Chances R Liquor and Tobacco Licenses. No further discussion. All ayes ...MC

d. Johnston made a motion and Bebee seconded that the City participate in the 2022 Highway 141 Garage Sales and remit the \$100 advertising fee. No further discussion. All ayes ...MC
