Remembering Peter Thorne

In January 1974, Rye resident Peter Horne was asked by the Concerned Citizens of Rye to moderate the special town meeting to consider the proposal to build an oil refinery on Great Bay with pipelines running under Rye and a terminal at the Rye Isles of Shoals. As a result of this meeting, Rye voted overwhelmingly against the proposal and it was eventually defeated.

In 2016 RHS published "Rye's Battle of the Century: Saving the Seacoast From Olympic Oil" by Lisa Moll. Peter Horne was instrumental in this effort, even contributing a memoir of his participation. Peter spoke in June at the book launch event and at the end he led the audience in the defiant 1974 song "Ode to Olympic Oil."

Peter Horne passed away in November, but he will live on as a shining example of citizen activism.
