
"Faith comes from hearing the Word of God." Romans 10:17

"We must pay more careful attention to what we've <u>heard</u>, so that we do not drift away!" Hebrews 2:1 (NIV)

What Hebrews is saying is, if you don't pay careful attention to the things you've heard, you will drift away. You will not be able to recall the Word when you need it. It's simple, pay attention to God and God will pay attention to you!

What's the difference between hearing and *listening*? Two words _____



Hearing means that I am within earshot or audible range. Just because I can hear someone talking doesn't mean I am listening to the conversation. Listening requires *paying attention*; it requires us to take note. It starts our brain's recorder. When you begin to listen, your brain begins recording.

Jesus' Answer to Improving Your Hearing

Read Matthew 13:1-13 (NLT)

"Later that same day Jesus left the house and sat beside the lake. A large crowd soon gathered around him, so he got into a boat. Then he sat there and taught as the people stood on the shore. He told many stories in the form of parables, such as this one:

The whole Bible is full of parables.

What is a parable? A ______ of the Kingdom of Heaven or an _____ with a Heavenly meaning.

"Listen! A farmer went out to plant some seeds. As he scattered them across his field, some seeds fell on a footpath, and the birds came and ate them. Other seeds fell on shallow soil with underlying rock. The seeds sprouted quickly because the soil was shallow. But the plants soon wilted under the hot sun, and since they didn't have deep roots, they died. Other seeds fell among thorns that grew up and choked out the tender plants. Still other seeds fell on fertile soil, and they produced a crop that was thirty, sixty, and even a hundred times as much as had been planted! Anyone with ears to hear should listen and understand." V10. "His disciples came and asked him, 'Why do you use parables when you talk to the people?'"

V19. The seed that fell on the represents: Those who hear the message about the Kingdom and don't understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away the seed that was planted in their hearts.	
These represent the non-believers, and the new believers that have no understanding. These are our responsibility to make sure that they are a part of a learning ministry.	
V20. The seed on the represents: Those who hear the message and immediately receive it with joy, but since they don't have deep roots, they don't last long. They fall away as soon as they have problems or are persecuted for believing God's word. (offended in some way)	
These represent a lot of Christians. They receive the Word with joy, but they have no roots to stabilize them, No consistent Bible study, No small group studies and no personal fellowship time with God.	
V22. The seed that fell among therepresents: Those who hear God's Word, but all too quickly the message is crowded out by the worries of life and the pursuit of wealth, so no fruit is produced.	
These Christians have a preoccupied mind; they are usually very, very busy with life. They have very little or no time at all for fellowshipping with the body of Christ or with God.	
V23. The seed that fell onrepresents:
