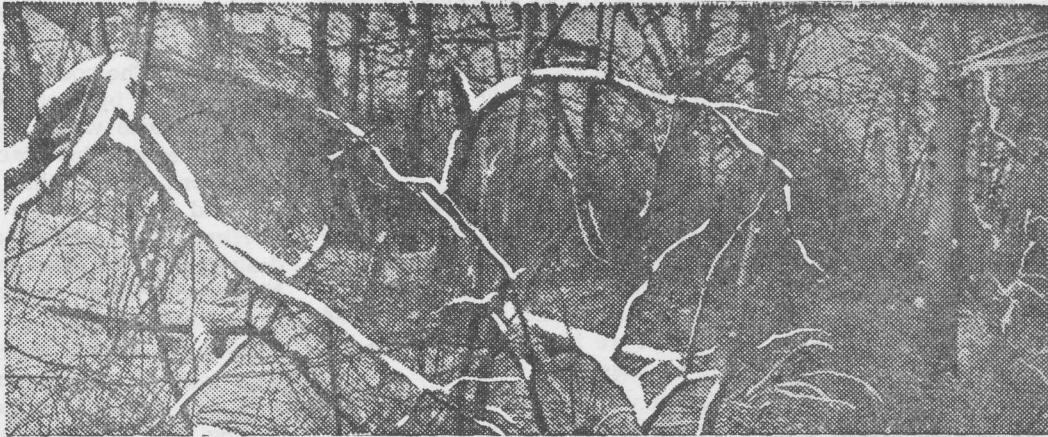

There is a verse in the book of Hebrews that should gripe each of our hearts, Heb. 9:27, "And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment;"

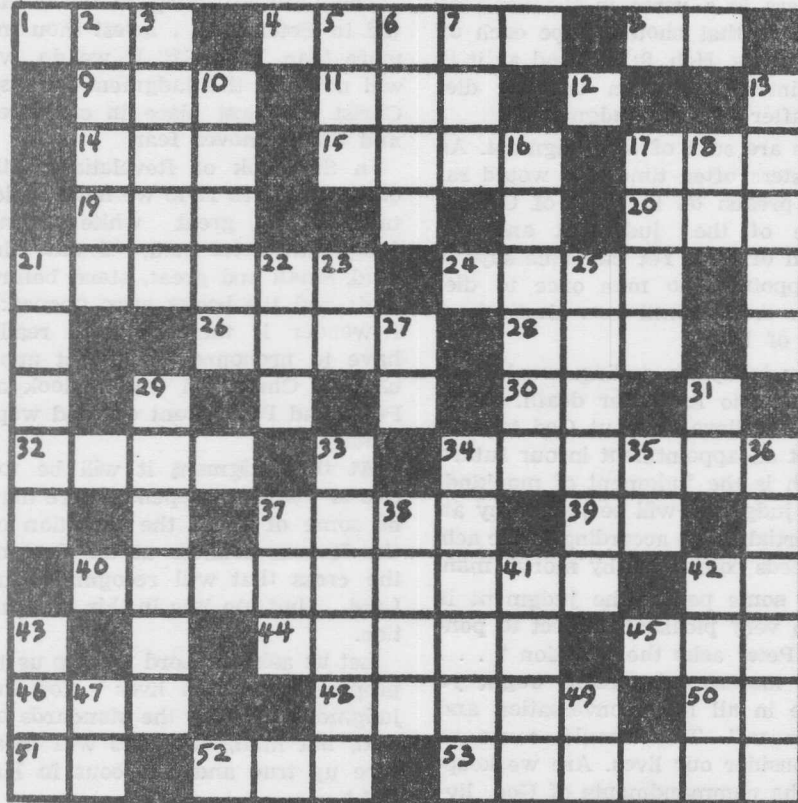

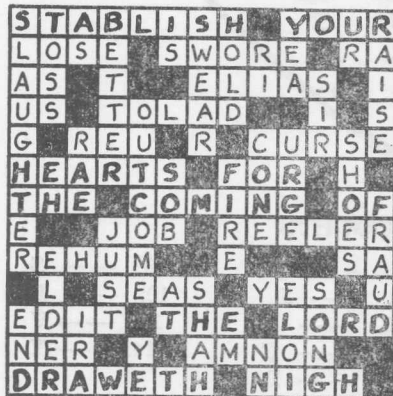

## A SHADOW IN THE BIBLE

If we are walking away from the sun when it is setting in the western sky, we can see our own shadow on the ground before us. If we stand still, and someone draws the outline of our shadow on the ground; that person, even if he had never seen us, from looking at that shadow could tell whether it was made by a large or small person, by a boy or girl.

The Bible is like a landscape spread around us. In the Old Testament, there are many things that seem to us like the shadows we see often on sunny days. This means that people and events we read about in the Old Testament are to teach us about Jesus and the work that Jesus was to do for us when he came to the world to be our Saviour.

The story of Noah's Ark teaches us a very important lesson about Christ. Jesus is the true Ark of which Noah's ark was only a shadow.

God said to Noah, "Come thou and all thy house into the ark." (Gen. 7:1) The 16th verse of the same chapter says, "and the Lord shut him in." Noah believed what God said to him, and did what God told him to do and he was saved.

Jesus Christ died to save us from our sins. Yet we cannot be saved unless we believe in Him as our Saviour and obey His word.

This, boys and girls, is very important for us to know. Let me tell you a story that may help you to understand.

This story is about an English nobleman who lived at least a hundred years ago. He was a very earnest Christian. He had a large number of people working for him who

were very poor. He tried in many ways to do them good, but he could not get them to believe the Bible and become Christians. This made

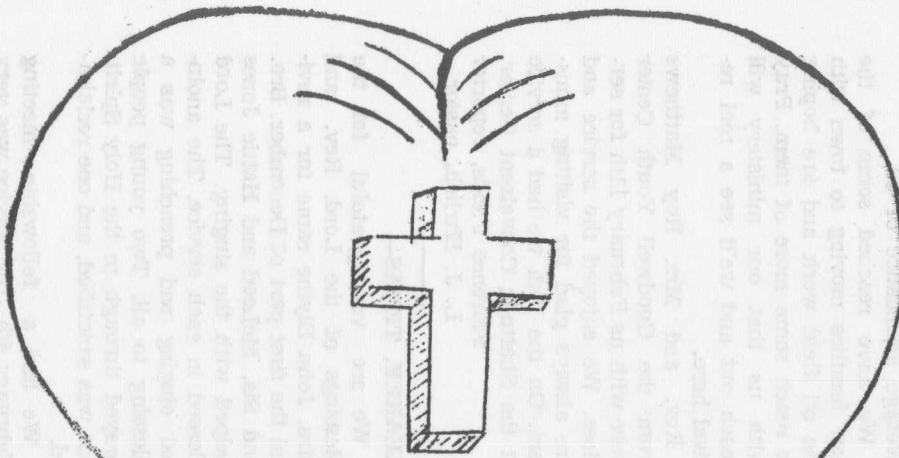

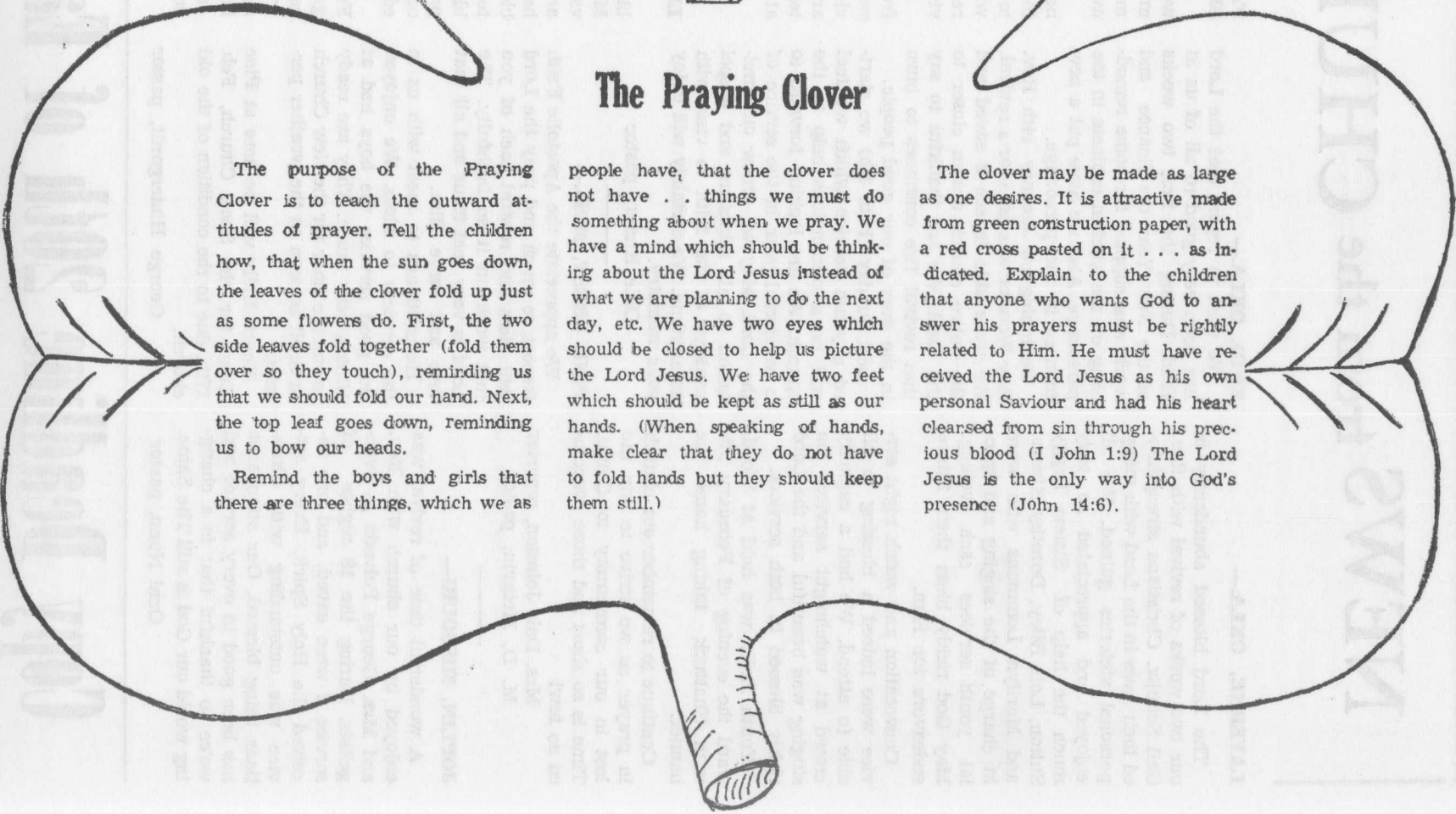
## The Praying Clover

The purpose of the Praying Clover is to teach the outward attitudes of prayer. Tell the children how, that when the sun goes down, the leaves of the clover fold up just as some flowers do. First, the two side leaves fold together (fold them over so they touch), reminding us that we should fold our hand. Next, the top leaf goes down, reminding us to bow our heads.

Remind the boys and girls that there are three things, which we as

people have, that the clover does not have . . . things we must do something about when we pray. We have a mind which should be thinking about the Lord Jesus instead of what we are planning to do the next day, etc. We have two eyes which should be closed to help us picture the Lord Jesus. We have two feet which should be kept as still as our hands. (When speaking of hands, make clear that they do not have to fold hands but they should keep them still.)

The clover may be made as large as one desires. It is attractive made from green construction paper, with a red cross pasted on it . . . as indicated. Explain to the children that anyone who wants God to answer his prayers must be rightly related to Him. He must have received the Lord Jesus as his own personal Saviour and had his heart cleansed from sin through his precious blood (I John 1:9) The Lord Jesus is the only way into God's presence (John 14:6).

## ARTICLE I

## REWARDS OF THE WICKED

In writing on this Bible subject we feel that it is necessary that we first study on some scriptures teaching us that life comes through Christ and that we only have Eternal or Spiritual life in and through Christ. This is one Bible subject that gives Christ his rightful place. In St. John 3:16 "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." This scripture teaches us that God's love is so great that if the sinner would only repent and believe then he would not perish but be given life.

Again in St. John 5:24 "Verily, verily I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life." This tells us that we have Life through Christ. In St. John 10-10 Jesus tells us that, "The thief cometh not, but for to steal and to kill, and to destroy: I AM come that they might have LIFE, and that they might have it more abundantly." Surely Satan seeks to kill, and destroy, But JESUS came that we might have life and only in him do we have this life.

I John 4:9 "In this was manifested the LOVE of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten SON into the world, that we might LIVE through him." Thank God that we do have this life through his Son Jesus. Again in I John 5: 11-13 we find these words, "And this is the record, that God hath given to us, ETERNAL LIFE, and this life is in his SON, He that hath the Son hath life; and he that hath not the Son hath not life. These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the Name of the Son of God."

These scriptures tell us that if we have the Son of God we have life and we know that we have this life and if we DO NOT have the Son of

God in our hearts we do not have life, these scriptures are very definite in telling us that ONLY IN JESUS do we have this life.

In Eccl. 12: 7 the scripture tells us that in death the body returns back to dust or corruption, and the spirit returns to God who gave it, then in Job 17: 13-17 Job said, "I wait, the grave is mine house." We believe that in death the body decays and the spirit returns to God and the Soul waits in the GRAVE UNTIL THE Ressurrection of the dead to come forth to the Judgment of God to be judged worthy of Life or to be cast into the lake of Fire to be destroyed or burned up both Soul and body, root and branch.

We will now study several words that the Bible gives as the reward of the wicked people. These words are death, die, destroy, destruction, perish, and burn. First we will take the word, DEATH. Rom. 1:32 "Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them." We share the thought with you that they that committ sin are worthy of death. In Rom 6:23. "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is Eternal Life through Jesus Christ our Lord." WE know that the wages for Sin is death and if the sinner continues in sin can only hope for death. But if we serve God we can have life. In James 1:15 "Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death." Death is the reward for all sin. There is no promise whatsoever to the sinner that he can live, only death.

In Rev. 20:14-15 "And death and Hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. And whosoever was not found written in the book of LIFE was cast into the lake of fire." We share the thought with you that the word HELL here is referred to as the grave and not the destruction of the Wicked. The lake of fire is referred to as the

second death.

In Rev. 21:8 we find "But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers and Idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death." This tells us that the person that does these things will be cast into the lake of fire and completely burned up.

There is no such thing as a never dying Soul for God tells us that the Soul that sinneth shall die. In EZEK. 18:4 "Behold, all Souls are mine; as the soul of the father, so also the soul of the son is mine: the soul that sinneth, it shall DIE." Surely there is NO promise whatsoever to the Soul that sinneth having any life at all, only death. If any one had a never dying Soul they would have to be Immortal, and Immortality is given only to the righteous people.

God alone is the only IMMORTAL person today. This will be given to those in the age to come at the last trumpet of God when we are changed. We never do possess an immortal Soul but our bodies are changed to be fashioned like his body in a moment of time.

Man today is Mortal. Job said, "Shall mortal man be more just than God?" Job. 4:17. If you were changed. We never do possess an to continue to burn in the lake of fire as some teach, you as a sinner, would have to be immortal. If we were to punish a dumb animal, not to kill it but to torment it day after day we would be put in jail for being cruel, yet people say God will only torment people for ages and not destroy them for their sins, but God said "the wages for sin is death."

Ezek. 18:31-32 "Cast away from you all your transgressions, whereby ye have transgressed; and make you a new heart and a new spirit: for why will ye die O house of Isreal? For I have no pleasure in the death of him that dieth, saith the Lord God; wherefore turn yourselves, and live Ye." God tells us that he has no pleasure in the death of him that dies, it is God's will that all will repent and live.

We are not to fear man that can kill the body but we are to Fear God. Matt. 10:28 "And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to Kill the soul; but rather fear Him (God) which is able to destroy BOTH soul and body in Hell." Man is able to kill our body but they can not kill the soul of man. This is the part of man that gives life as the root of a tree is the life of the tree, cut it off, it will grow up again from the roots. We are made up of three things: Body, Spirit and Soul. The wicked are destroyed in the lake of fire soul, spirit and body. In James 5:20 "Let him know, that he which converteth the sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins." This scripture tells us if the sinner will repent and turn from his wicked ways the soul will be saved from DEATH for the soul that sinneth shall die.

The word DESTROY. In Psm. 37: 38 "But the transgressors shall be destroyed together: the end of the wicked shall be cut off."

There is no life in destroy, only death. In Psm. 145:20 God tells us that ALL the wicked will be destroyed. The Bible tells us that our Body is the temple of God and if we defile the temple him shall God destroy. I Cor. 3:17 Even the Devil who has the power of death will be destroyed for in Heb. 2:14 we find that Christ took the body of flesh that through his death on the cross he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the Devil. Again in Rev. 20:10 the word tells us that the devil that deceived them was cast into the lake of fire and brimstone where the beast and false prophet are. So we find from these scriptures that even the Devil will be burned up in the lake of fire along with all the wicked people.

DESTRUCTION is another word the Bible uses as a reward of the wicked. In Matt. 7:13 "Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat."

Many are the wicked that are

traveling the broad way or road that will lead them to destruction in the lake of fire. 2 Thess. 1:8-9 tells us of those that know NOT God and who do not obey the Gospel of Jesus Christ will be punished with everlasting destruction.

The word PERISH is also used as the reward of the wicked people. In Luke 13:3 "I tell you Nay: but, except ye repent ye shall ALL like wise perish." There is no life in the word perish. St. John 3:14-15 tells us if the sinner will look upon Jesus and believe that he will not perish, but that he will have everlasting life. How simple it is to find life only to LOOK unto Jesus and believe and they can have Eternal life. Again in I Cor. 1:18 tells us that the "preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness but unto us which are saved it is the power of God."
