# **Words from Our Pastor**

My summer reading has included another book by author Phillip Yancey. Yancey is the author of an incredibly significant book entitled *What's So Amazing about Grace?* From what I have read, this book is one of – if not the most – poignant treatments of the concept of Grace. Grace has been described as unmerited favor, unearned mercy, God's loving kindness, and <u>G</u>od's <u>R</u>iches <u>At Christ's Expense</u>. Grace is an idea or concept that is unique to Christianity.

Jesus demonstrated God's grace – loving outcasts,
healing diseases, feeding the hungry, opening the eyes
of the blind, valuing those who were deemed to be of
no value, and forgiving the sins of people – at the cost of his own life on the
cross. Jesus showed us what grace is all about and then called his followers to
be people of grace.

Four years ago Yancey completed another book about grace entitled **Vanishing Grace: What Ever Happened to the Good News?** Sadly, in the later book Yancey focuses on the fact that the Amazing Grace of Jesus Christ seems to have vanished from many churches in America.

"Jesus came into this world," as John writes in his Gospel account (see John 1.1-14), "and we beheld his glory, the glory of the one and only Son of God, full of grace and truth."

Yancey points out that for several reasons – fear, lack of love (sometimes even overt hatred), self-seeking motives, deep rooted prejudices, and a lack of trust in God's sovereignty – many Christians in America today appear to be "full of truth" but "short on grace." We do not have to compromise what we hold to be true in order to be people of grace, but too often we compromise grace in order to stick to our convictions.

Same-sex relationships are not consistent with God's intention in creation, but despising or rejecting or even outright hostility towards those who affirm them is not consistent with grace. Placing a high value on the sanctity of life affirms the glory of God's creation, but venomous words and anger toward those who do not affirm this value lack grace. Welcoming strangers from other nations – just as Israel was commanded to do – expresses the love and heart of God and is an act of generous hospitality. But, seeing immigrants as people to be feared, as those who will take what we don't want to give, or by labeling all immigrants as a threat to our security is a failure to be persons of grace.

Grace may be amazing and world-changing but, to borrow the phrase from Dietrich Bonhoeffer – a German theologian and pastor martyred by the Nazis,

it must not be "cheap grace." Cheap grace "is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline. Communion without confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ."

In other words, Cheap Grace seeks the benefits of Christian faith without willingly embracing the cost – the cost of following Jesus in living and speaking and acting as people of grace.

You and I are on a journey of faith and called to be grace givers to one another as we join in worship and study and as we build a community of faith. And to others – our neighbors and friends (even those with whom we strongly disagree), people immigrating to and settling in El Cajon, and those who lack fresh water and sanitary bathrooms.

As we journey together let's help one another be people who, like Jesus, are full of grace and truth.

### **Building Bridges**

The summer has been quite busy with planning for the upcoming **Building Bridges with Our Muslim Neighbors** program. Beginning September 24<sup>th</sup> and ending October 6<sup>th</sup>, this unique immersion and outreach into Muslim culture is so much bigger than anyone anticipated. The deadline for applications is September 7<sup>th</sup>, so there is still time to apply at this printing. If you are unable to attend, please consider praying for:

 The participants - Pray we will have the number of participants we need. Pray that each participant comes away with a deeper understanding of Muslims and refugees, and that they will have concrete ways they can serve our Muslim neighbors.

- The instructors/panelists Pray over the instructors and panelists.
   Pray that they will be lead by God to teach us what we need to hear personally and corporately.
- The staff Pray that we will be able to see what God is doing and respond, and that we will stay focused on Jesus rather than be anxious about results. Pray for Pastor Jim as he helps us traverse this new path.
- Everyone involved Pray for both physical and spiritual well-being for everyone involved!

## **Summer Thoughts**

Throughout this summer, I found God honing in on one topic – loving everyone without inhibition, insecurity, or restriction. In the U.S., we are concerned about justice. Justice punishes evil – it is part of our worldview. We see God as a just God. But what about mercy and grace? Could any of us be Jesus-followers without God's incredible mercy and grace? I am learning that something beyond justice needs to take place in my heart. Jesus forgave all His enemies in spite of the physical and emotional pain He experienced.

Jesus said we were to love our enemies and pray for those who mistreat us. Some who perceive Syrian refugees as enemies have questioned our plan to reach out to them. Others have had concerns about our physical safety – we could get hurt by the refugees.

This summer, I grew in the knowledge that I am to love and serve all the

world – enemies or friends. This is not just for missionaries; this is for all who call themselves Christians. If Christians around the world are willing to give their lives to serve others in the name of Jesus, then I certainly can serve an unreached people group down the street where I am more likely to get hurt in a car crash than endure physical harm from a refugee.

### **English Camp**

A few of us had the opportunity to put this love into practice. For one week in August, five members of Trinity Church helped transport more than 35 Syrian refugee children between the ages of 10 and 15 from El Cajon to an English camp held at College Avenue Baptist Church. The camp was put on by a Christian nonprofit that is focused on Muslim refugees in San Diego. We all had an opportunity to converse with our students a bit and get a snapshot of refugee life. We found ourselves loving these dear children who have been through so much trauma in their young lives.

### What Can You Do?

Consider praying for Syrian refugees, especially if you have anything but love for them. Pray that they would know God's love. Pray that we would grow in love for all who have been created in God's image including Muslims. In praying allow God's love to cover you and let it flow to those around you.
