TITLE EVENTS

- Springtime Bloom (0-7 yr, 8-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-17 & 18+ yr.)
 Novice only. These athletes are new to twirling, working on basic twirling skills, and are NOT completing more than a one spin. They will compete in modeling, basic strut, and presentation.
- Springtime Petal (0-7 yr, 8-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-17 & 18+ yr.)
 <u>Beginner:</u> These athletes have at least one year of twirling experience, can complete basic single or double rolls, and are not completing more than a two spin and single element tricks (toss illusion, toss cartwheel, etc). They will compete in Solo, Strut or X-strut, and 2-Baton..
- Springtime Delight (0-7 yr, 8-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-17 & 18+ yr.)
 <u>Intermediate:</u> These athletes have more than one year of twirling experience, can complete combination rolls and are attempting a variety of catches on 2 spins, trying 3 spins, and adding body/catches/spins to high tricks. They will compete in Solo, Strut or X-strut, and 2-Baton.
- Springtime Elegance (0-7 yr, 8-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-17 & 18+ yr.)
 Advanced: These athletes are seasoned competitors. They compete in State events. They will compete in Interview, Solo, Strut or X-strut, and 2-Baton.
- Athletes may not enter more than one level.
- The overall winner in each group will be determined using place points: 1st place=1 point, 2nd place=2 point, etc. For example, an athlete placing 1st in Solo (1 point), 4th in Modeling (4 points), and 2nd in 2-Baton (2 points) would have a total of 1+4+2=7 points. The athlete with the fewest place points in each age division will be the winner. A tie in place points will be broken by combing total scores in all disciplines.
- Music will be the USTA advanced Solo music. Points will not be deducted for finishing early.
- *The Title Events are separate from the "regular" individual competition.

SOUTHERN SPICE QUALIFIER

- Complete with your solo to earn a spot in the combined state finals!
- Top three in each age group (0-7 yr, 8-10 yr, 11-12 yr, 13-14 yr, 15-17 yr, 18+ yr) will advance to our tournament finals.
- We will have 3 champions from each tournament based on the age break down:
 - o Juvenile Champion (0-10 yr) will advance to the Louisiana/Texas Southern Spice Champion event
 - o Junior Champion (11-14 yr) will advance to the Louisiana/Texas Southern Spice Champion event
 - o Senior Champion (15+ yr) will advance to the Louisiana/Texas Southern Spice Champion event
- Please note that once you have been awarded the champion at any of the participating contests this season, you may not enter this event again.
- Once you qualify you must sign an intent to compete form and an entry fee will be due in the amount of \$25.00 for competing at the Louisiana/Texas "Southern Spice" event.

Let your school spirit shine! Compete in our Who Dat School Competition and showcase your UIL Solo, Feature Twirler Routine or Twirler Line with the fun event! (Athletes may use multiple baton, no props.) We will award 1 winner from each of the categories listed.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- Entering more than one level:
 - Effective September 1st, 2019, athletes may only enter "one level up" from their current level in a particular event. For example, a Beginner athlete may enter Intermediate, not Advanced since that would be TWO levels up.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- This is a USTA sanctioned contest with USTA rules, regulations, judges and music.
- Only baton events are sanctioned by the United States Twirling Association.
- Non-sanctioned events will be noted with an asterisk on the entry form.
- No refunds for any reason (other than cancellation of the entire event). Postponement due to weather is NOT a cancellation.
- Neither contest directors or contest facilities will be responsible for accidents, injuries or loss of property.
- Program will be emailed to coaches only to check for errors.
- Contestants will compete at the age they are as of August 31st of contest year.
- There is a non-member fee of \$5.00 for individuals. USTA memberships may be purchased at ustwirling.com
- Set system will be utilized. See program, note set, and lane for each event entered.
- Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated.
- Rule changes made by USTA Board of Directors will automatically go into effect at proper time and take priority over those stated
- Entering more than one level: Effective September 1, 2019, athletes may only enter one level up from their current level in a particular event. For example, a Beginner athlete may enter Intermediate, not Advanced, since that would be two levels up.
- Group/Freestyle comments will be provided via digital recording and emailed to coaches (or scoresheets).
- Music for groups/freestyles must be emailed to twirllp@yahoo.com prior to competition.
- Team/corp age division is determined by averaging age of members. You may enter older division if at least one member is in that division.
- Athlete may be a member of more than one team/corp, but team must be in separate categories. Athlete cannot compete
 against self.
- If team/corp member cannot perform on contest day and it changes category entered, team may perform for Evaluation only.
- SMOKING PROHIBITED anywhere on school property and at USTA competitions.
- A 1st place win is a "win" with more than one athlete in each category.
- Novice contestant/group who has won less than 3 competitive first place awards in that event.
- Beginner contestant/group who has won less than 5 competitive first place awards in that event.
- Intermediate contestant/group who has won less than 10 competitive first place awards in that event.
- Advanced contestant/group who has won 10 or more competitive first place awards in that event.
- USTA recognizes all other twirling organizations 1st place wins, except USTA Strut.
- The main goal of USTA is the development and promotion of *Good Sportsmanship*. Therefore, athlete/group may enter one level above current classification.
- Critique events comments will be provided via digital recording and emailed (or scoresheets).
- Contest director has the right to combine/divide age groups as entries warrant.
- In the event of a discrepancy, the judge's master is final.
- Age groups and awards may vary slightly at the discretion of the Contest Director.
- \$30.00 NSF fee for returned checks.
- You may evaluate no more than 2 levels of Compulsories or Movement Technique at any event.
- The Westlake High School Color guard will charge an admission fee for spectators. Please support their concession stand as well for fundraising efforts.
- *Show Twirl may use props

The Catherine Lewis & ** Memorial Essay Competition

Catherine Golden Lewis was a life-long resident of Sulphur, LA. She was fascinated with baton twirling during her younger years and often laughed as she told the story of how she ended up a drummer instead of a twirler because of a silly waist wrap that flew across the gym floor at her one and only audition for high school majorette.
