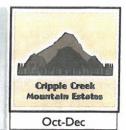

This year, we have had an aggressive list of maintenance projects to include:

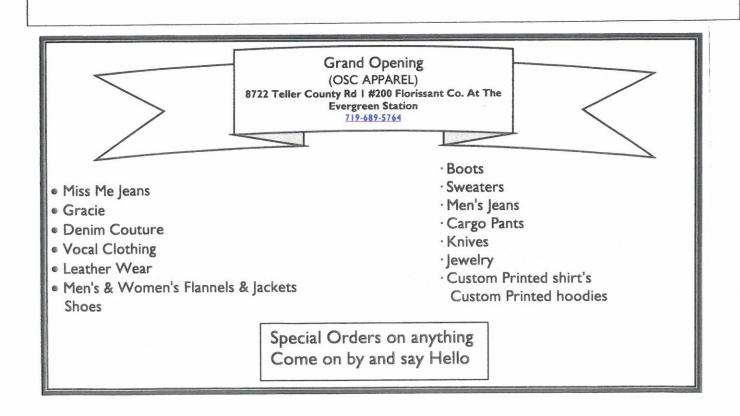

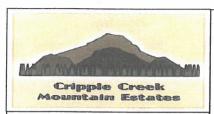
Due to a number of issues regarding hot water for showers, a second hot water heater has been added. This addition increased the hot water.
