Minimum Acceptable Construction Standards for Permanent Basketball Goals

Sections 1, 2, 3 and 8 Only

The minimum acceptable construction standards for erection and/or placement of a permanent basketball goal are as follows:

- 1) Goal must never be in front of the front building line;
- 2) Goal must never violate side building lines;
- 3) If the backboard is mounted on a pole, the pole must be embedded in sufficient concrete to maintain the goal in a vertical position;
- 4) All goal supports, backboards, rims and nets must be well maintained at all times;
- 5) The minimum construction specifications are as follows:
 - a. **Pole** must be black or white metal. Creosoted posts are not acceptable.
 - b. **<u>Backboard</u>** must be commercially manufactured out of materials that will not weather, warp or disintegrate.
 - c. <u>Net:</u> Goals must always have a net, and net must be well maintained.

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This set of minimum acceptable construction standards is promulgated under the authority of the Declaration of Protective Covenants for Sugar Mill Homeowners Association. All improvements, additions, placement, changes, etc. to the exterior of the home must be approved by the Architectural Control Committee prior to construction.
