Even though Mandy is an experienced mother she loves attending Hope House classes because she feels you can never learn too much when it comes to taking care of babies. The diapers and wipes she receives for attending classes has really helped her make ends meet as she has yet been able to return to work.

Experiencing pregnancy for the first time and nervous about being moms, they took time to attend Hope House "Moms2B" sessions after school at DB-- learning about healthy pregnancy, childbirth, and setting goals for their futures. They attended the annual TTOPS (Teaching Teens Outstanding Parenting Skills) Conference at Celebration Church hosted by the Sullivan County Health Department and a collaboration of other agencies such as Hope House.
