





HAVE YOU HEARD? Corvette Racing is going to race in China on November 18th to compete in the FIA World Endurance Championship's 6-hour race in Shanghai. To meet deadlines, the team needed to have its entry fully organized in July.



The Corvette team will field a single car in the

GTE-Pro class, bringing the number of manufacturers in the class to six (Corvette, Porsche, BMW, Ferrari, Ford and possibly Aston Martin). The Corvette C7.R will be specially outfitted in Chevrolet's "Redline" livery (see photo above) which was revealed at the 2015 SEMA Show.

Corvette Racing will use a unique driver line-up for the race and select crew members from both teams to ensure they have all their bases covered for the trip. The majority of tools, parts and equipment will be shipped to Shanghai by sea, leaving prior to the end of the race season, with the C7.R being sent to Shanghai by air freight following October's *Petit Le Mans* race.

Since the July newsletter, the Corvette Racing team has been very busy. In mid-June they raced at the 24-Hours of LeMans where the No. 63 car finished 5th in their class. Unfortunately the No. 64 car began to unravel early with front end suspension problems, then handling issues and finally engine overheating which resulted in the car's retirement from the track.

Less than two weeks later, the Watkins Glen race began a critical "3-race in 4-weeks" period. At the Glen, the team was cheered on by approx. 275 enthusiaists at the Corvette Corral. At the conclusion of this 6-hour endurance race, the No. 4 Corvette placed 3rd; the No. 3 placed 4th.

On to CTMP the following weekend where Corvette Racing has enjoyed numerous successes over the years. More podium finishes at CTMP - 2nd place for the No. 3 car and 3rd place for the No. 4 car. And another record attendance at the Corral!

The busy-ness didn't stop there. Lime Rock followed two weeks later with high hopes that our team would achieve their 100th victory in IMSA competition. With just 13 minutes to go, the No. 3 lost the lead to a Ford due to an "off-course excursion". Jan Magnussen later said it was "hard to swallow" after dominating the race from pole position. The outcome was 2nd place for the No. 3 car and 4th place for the No. 4 car.

All three races following LeMans were held in record-setting heat and

humidity, sapping fans' energy but not the team's desire to win!

The No. 3 team of Jan Magnussen and Antonio Garcia now stand in 2nd place in Driver Points at 207, just 1 point behind the class leader; and the No. 4 team of Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner hold 5th place with 195 points. In Manufacturer's points, Chevrolet sits in 2nd position with 219 points.



Here comes the ZR-1

Sure to steal the scene, the Corvette ZR-1 will come out later this year. Under the hood, this bona fide sports car houses the LT-5 engine. This powerplant boasts a four-camshaft, 32-valve, 5.7 litre, 375 horsepower configuration. Coupled to a six-speed transmission, this machine is sure to live up to its ultimate Corvette

ranking. Robert English of the **Financial Post**, who recently reviewed the car, said: "The 1989 Corvette, particularly the Lotus-equipped when it arrives, is General Motors' new flagship. It proves the company has people with the talent to build world-beating cars."

Who builds Vette's LT5 engine?

While the LT5 engine was designed and developed by GM's Group Lotus Division in Hethel, England in conjunction with C-P-C Engineering, it is being manufactured under contract by Mercury in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

The relatively low volume and highly specialized manufacturing process of this engine program makes the Stillwater plant an ideal choice.

This is where Mercury produces its MERCRUISER stern drive and inboard engines, many of which are based on marine conversions of standard GM automotive engines.

Final assembly is carried out at a series of work stations on two parallel lines in an area closed off from the rest of the Stillwater facility to maintain a clean environment.

Operating like an engine-building shop, the engines are assembled by hand.




