

3pm 2nd Sunday of Easter - Divine Mercy Sunday

16 April 2023 (Year A) "As the Father has sent me, so I'm sending you."

"Holy Week, culminating in our Easter celebration has once again come and gone. Participating in the liturgy has probably been a deeply moving and inspiring experience for many. But now life goes on as before, in a world that does not seem to have changed. The words of an Easter Preface, "the joy of the resurrection renews the whole world" don't seem to ring true as we hear of ongoing acts of war, ecological destruction, violence and discrimination still occurring in our time. But -we should not let a mood of despair or helplessness overwhelm us. That is not the way of the Gospel.

Today we hear of two appearances of Jesus following his death and burial. In the first appearance, the risen Lord brings "Shalom" – peace of heart and mind to a group of disciples who had locked themselves away in fear and shame since the horrific death of their leader. What a dramatic life changing situation it must have been when the One they had to abandon at His most vulnerable time, became present to them without a word of reproach. "Shalom' – "Peace be with you" and He breathed into them the Holy Spirit". Their faith restored, they are animated to accept Jesus' commissioning to share what they had received with others.

Today's liturgy celebrates Resurrection faith -derived from a shared experience of God's merciful and undying love in the midst human tragedy and death.

Resurrection faith awakens a sense of commitment to share the 'Jesus mission' to liberate, heal and restore friendship with God, each other and the world at large.



We recall the appearance of Jesus to Thomas. We could drift through these Easter weeks repeating abstractly, "Happy are they who have not seen yet believe' or we might learn from Thomas traditionally dubbed a doubter, but in essence a forthright and honest person. To be able, recognizing by touching the wounds of his beloved master was all he needed to awaken him to the power of the resurrection to transform human lives by sharing the mission of Jesus.

Our faith is grounded in this witness of the apostles which had its origins in an overwhelming experience: a meeting, against all their expectations, with the final achievement in God's work of creation, the greatness of the Risen Lord who overcame agonizing persecution, abandonment and death to welcome them back into the Divine Mercy of their ever faithful God. The first reading today presents a snapshot of the early Christian community in Jerusalem. The whole community remained faithful to the teaching of the apostles, gathering in prayer as a community, breaking bread together as a family in their homes, sharing their peace, material possessions and support according to what each brother, sister or newcomer's needed: living by corporal and spiritual 'Works of Mercy" according to the Mission of Jesus.

Like Thomas, we should wish to see and <u>BE</u> bearers of Jesus' healing power: identifying and attending to the wounds of our brothers and sisters; undoing oppression of violence and discrimination through peace, compassionate respect and inclusion; bringing back into life in practical ways those alienated by poverty, illness, loneliness, despair and abuse. Thomas' recognition of his Lord and God in Jesus' wounds of suffering and death gives us every reason to believe in the impossible and to take up the challenge Jesus sets before us:

'As the Father has sent me so I'm sending you!'

Divine Mercy Sunday.

In 2016, Pope Francis called us all to an extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy. It was a Year marked by the issue of a papal document Misericordiae Vultus. In this document he stated: "it is my burning desire that the Christian people may reflect on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy... Let us enter more deeply into the heart of the Gospel where the poor have a special experience of God's mercy. Jesus introduces us to these works of mercy in his preaching so that we can know whether or not we are living as his disciples. Let us rediscover these Corporal works of mercy to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, heal the sick, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead. And let us not forget the spiritual works of mercy: to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences, bear patiently those who do us ill, and pray for the living and the dead. We cannot escape the Lord's words to us, and they will

serve as criteria upon which we will be judged. Let us not forget the words of Saint John of the Cross: "As we prepare to leave this life, we will be judged on the basis of love".

This is a cause of great joy for you, even though you may for a short time have to bear being plagued by all sorts of trials; so that, when Jesus Christ is revealed, your faith will have been tested and proved like gold only it is more precious than gold, which is

corruptible even though it bears testing by fire – and then you will have praise and glory and honour. You did not see him, yet you love him; and still without seeing him, you are already filled with a joy so glorious that it cannot be described, because you believe; and you are sure of the end to which your faith looks forward, that is, the salvation of your souls.

SEQUENCE

Victimae Paschali Laudes Christians, to the Paschal Victim offer sacrifice and praise. The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb; and Christ, the undefiled, hath sinners to his Father reconciled. Death with life contended: combat strangely ended! Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign. Tell us, Mary: say what thou didst see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as he rose! The angels there attesting; shroud with grave-clothes resting. Christ, my hope, has risen: he goes before you into Galilee. That Christ is truly risen from the dead we know. Victorious king, thy mercy show!

GOSPEL JOHN 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you', and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me,

so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive,

they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me.

Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

THE NICENE CREED.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
