

News from the Library

After Halloween is over (Thanks for the support Friends of the Library!) we slow down a little for November at the library. Our regular programming continues with things like storytimes, afterschool activities, chess club, homework help, coding classes and Minecraft. For teens we have TAB and SSTR. For adults we have chess, knitting, book clubs, and Crafternoons. In addition we have a few special events.

Our biggest event is a series of workshops in Square One with a group we discovered at the Maker Faire: **TAPIGAMI**. What is **TAPIGAMI**? **TAPIGAMI** is an art form that can effortlessly jump from fine art installation to hands-on creative workshops for adults and children. At its core, **TAPIGAMI** is the art of applying imagination to rolls of tape. Social interaction and creativity fuels **TAPIGAMI** and the medium of tape allows the artist to create sculptures anywhere they go.

The originator of this masking tape craft is an artist from Sacramento, so we were able to bring this cool craft to the library. We will have three workshops in November and December—one for kids and families (Nov. 3^{rd}), one for teens (Nov. 17^{th}), and one for adults (Dec. 1^{st}). Free tickets can be reserved through the Eventbrite website while supplies last. Space is limited to 30 on each workshop. We will fill any remaining spots, or no-shows, at the door on the day of the event.

We have a monthly special evening storytime this fall. This month it is a **Family Fort Night Storytime** on Thursday, November 16th at 5:30 in the Children's Room. Families can bring some supplies for fort building, like sheets and blankets, and we will supply some as well as string and clips. Bring a flashlight because we will be reading around a campfire and families can also read in their forts, play with glow sticks, and having some fun in a darkened room!

Starting in November, we have a new **Science and Society Discussion Series** for adults. All are welcome to attend this on-going lecture/presentation and discussion series regarding Science and Society. The first two meetings will focus on Toxic Tragedies. Part One is Toxic Tragedies in Modern Societies: All Too Common. The speaker is Dr. Robert Rice, the Chair of Environmental Toxicology at UC Davis. A survey of toxic tragedies in the U.S. over the past 200 years demonstrates a need for regulation to prevent their occurrence. Wednesday, November 1st from 6-7:30 in the Leake Room. Part Two is on Wednesday, December 6th and the topic is The Systemic Basis for Toxic Tragedies. Dr. Rice will discuss how, reflecting market failures, toxic tragedies are continuing today and undermine our trust in the regulatory system.

In December, the special evening storytime will be a Cookies and **Books Bilingual Storytime**, on Tuesday, December 12th at 5:30. Families can enjoy a cozy time at the library with books about a mouse who loves cookies and the adventures he has with his friend. After the books and songs, they can make the mouse from a lunch bag and enjoy a cookie after all the hard work.

In December we will also be holding a **Harry Potter-themed Yule Ball**, on Saturday, December 16th from 1-2:30 (tentative time) as our holiday party. We will be collaborating with the Davis Science Collective to create some Hogwarts classes, crafts, and fun for children. This should be a fun change for our winter party, and we anticipate the theme will be an attractive one for the community!

Author Patricia V. Davis will speak during Brown Bag Book Club on Wednesday, December 6th at noon in the Leake Center at the Woodland Public Library, 250 First Street. This event is sponsored by the Friends of the Woodland Public Library and is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be provided.

Patricia V. Davis is the author of the bestselling Harlot's Sauce: A Memoir of Food, Family, Love, Loss and Greece, and The Diva Doctrine: 16 Universal Principles Every Woman Needs to Know.

Set aboard the RMS Queen Mary, her debut novel Cooking for Ghosts: Book I in The Secret Spice Cafe Trilogy was nominated for the National Book Critics Circle Award for Fiction and is a Pulpwood Queens Book Club Selection. The next in the series, Spells and Oregano: Book II in The Secret Spice Cafe Trilogy, is set to release soon.

Despite the diversity of Patricia's writing projects, they share the universal theme of "female dynamism," a term she's coined which signifies women taking positive action to support each other and better the world around them. 1,000 BOOKS BEFORE KINDERGARTEN SETS CHILDREN ON THE PATH TO SUCCESS . ONE BOOK AT A TIME

Families are invited to join the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program at the Woodland Public Library. The 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program is a nationwide challenge that encourages parents and caregivers to regularly read aloud to their children. By reading just one book a night, families can reach the 1,000-book goal in three years and provide their children essential early literacy skills.

Research shows that the most reliable predictor of school success is being read to during early childhood. Reading to children from an early age can help close the vocabulary gap and prepare children to enter kindergarten with the skills they need to succeed. Most importantly, sharing books with children promotes a lifelong love of books and reading.

The 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program is available to all families with children between the ages of birth and five years. Registration is open. For more information, stop by the children's desk at the library, or visit our Beanstack website.

This program is free of charge.
