The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday in the PCUSA, and many other Protestant denominations. Did you know that World Communion Sunday is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the world? It was started in 1933 in Pittsburgh, PA. Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating that the church founded on Jesus Christ peacefully shares God-given goods in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed.

To demonstrate how we have become one from many here in West Fargo, if you have something from your particular heritage, whether it is a kilt or a dashiki, lederhosen or bunad, please wear it on October 1.




PULPIT SUPPLY

NOVEMBER MISSION & OUTREACH FOCUS



Thank you to everyone who donated items, or money to buy them, for PATH during September. As usual, we collected a good variety of items for these young people setting up their first apartments as they "age out of the system."

Our October focus will be "Feed My Starving Children (FMSC)." If you have been watching TV, you have undoubtedly seen ads for the upcoming Fargo Pack in January at the Fargo Dome. The organizers have set a goal of packing 10 million meals in the 10 days. In order to do that, they need to be able to purchase the ingredients and packaging, and ship them out of Fargo. We will be collecting money for this cause.

To spark your giving, here are some statistics about the pack: at least 6,200 children die daily worldwide from lack of food; FMSC uses less than 10% of donations for administrative costs, meaning over 90% actually goes for food; \$.29 will provide one meal for a child; \$106 will feed one child for one year; \$1000 will feed 9 people for a year. Checks can be written to the church, with FMSC or Feed My Starving Children in the memo line, or put cash in a pew envelope, or other envelope, marked FMSC.

Please prayerfully consider what you can give, remembering what Paul told the church at Corinth, "Do as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."


LADIES CIRCLE
