

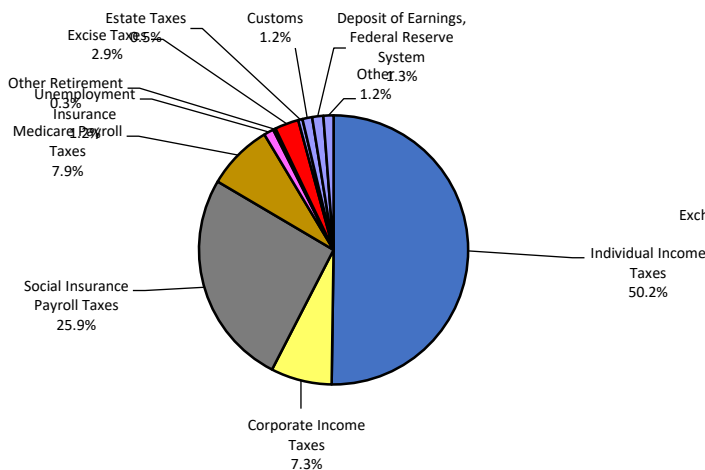
**THE PIES DON'T LIE:  
A WEBINAR ON THE WHITE HOUSE 2021 BUDGET  
REQUEST AND CAPITOL HILL'S APPROPRIATIONS' RESPONSE  
APRIL 7, 2021

It is important that we all talk about the budget request for 2021. Since it is an election year, consideration of the request by the 116<sup>th</sup> Congress will be compressed. The House and Senate appropriations subcommittees will be active early.

The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) forecasts that the annual deficit of the federal budget will continue to be more than \$1 trillion for the coming decade. The national debt has increased \$3 trillion since January 2017 when President Donald Trump was inaugurated. The 2017 tax cuts for corporations and the wealthy have contributed to this but so also has been the growth in mandatory spending.

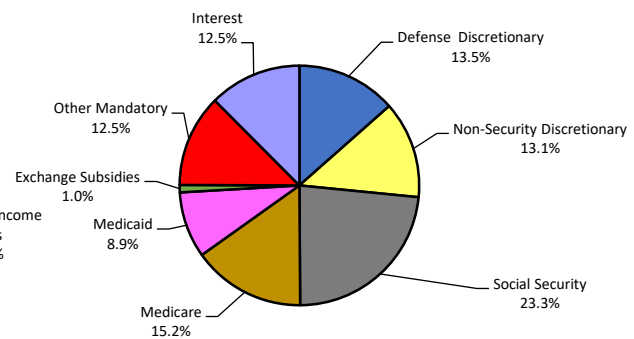
Look at the pie charts below that reflect the budget request put forth by the Trump Administration on February 10, 2020.
