

Heavenly Attitudes in a Stewarded Life -----With Pastor Eric

I've been asked by people over time in different ways, "What do you think heaven is like?" My responses have changed a bit here and there but one thing that sticks is "Heaven is where

we will sing praises to God and rejoice all the time." However, we don't have to wait to experience heaven wherever we are. Listen to Paul...perhaps a glimpse of heaven in these words.

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. – Philippians 4:4-7

I printed these verses and hung them on my wall across from my desk in the office. Every day I read them and think about how present God is to me and whatever situation I find myself involved with. "Don't worry about anything...". Paul is probably writing this letter from jail, and I am sure that he struggled with some anxiety about those fledgling churches out there. As a pastor, I find myself worried about you, my beloved congregation. I observe your anxieties about an ever-changing world and lives pulled this way and that. Nobody seems to have much time to focus on anything or anyone. Before you know it, it's gone...it's over... and

time marches onward. The "it" can be anything, or anyone right? I am writing this newsletter article with the nagging thought that I had just written last months?! I could sure use that "peace" of God guarding my heart and mind – how about you?

This month we are going to focus a bit on some stewardship concepts. I'm not talking about money, time and talent surveys but lifestyle and attitudes toward life in the Lord's presence. Paul taps into this idea in these few inspiring verses in Philippians. We will consider faith, persistence, gratitude, and humility. We find these traits in Paul's letter with words like "always" and "thanksgiving" and "requests" and yes, "the Lord is near" which is to be believed and trusted above all else. I would highly recommend posting these verses on your phone or fridge or screensaver and simply read them every day and let them permeate your mind and heart. Please remember that you are not alone in trying to figure this stuff out for your life. Paul is writing to "you (plural)" the community of faith. We are gifted to help others and together we make a joy-full life.

Let us pray. Heavenly Father, giver of every good and perfect gift, thank you for everything which makes us who we are in this life. Thank you for the time, the people, the breath. Thank you for the opportunities to share our gifts with freedom and great joy. Help us to realize the true gifts in giving and rejoice always in you, in Jesus' name. Amen.



Making a Lasting Impact

Phil has had a connection to LSI since his college years. While taking social work classes at Wartburg College, he was asked to tutor a student at LSI's Bremwood Residential Treatment Center in Waverly. Even years later, he and his wife, Phyllis, continued to support LSI programming by making a donation around Christmas each year.

When Phyllis passed away in 2012, Phil began looking at their investments and considering how he could make a positive impact long-term. Over the weekend, several disasters made the news. Here are some of the biggest ones:

- In Puerto Rico and the Caribbean, Hurricane Fiona brought torrential rainfall and devastating flooding to the islands. Almost exactly five years after Hurricane Maria, Puerto Rico is again experiencing an island-wide blackout and damaged buildings and infrastructure. Lutheran Disaster Response is working with the Caribbean Synod to develop an immediate response in impacted communities.
- In Alaska, the remnants of Typhoon Merbok have caused widespread flooding along the state's western coast. This was one of the worst storms in recent decades in Alaska, with strong waves and heavy rainfall damaging homes, seawalls, roads and other infrastructure. Officials are planning a quick relief period before the water freezes. Lutheran Disaster Response is working with the Alaska Synod to address the needs of those impacted by the storm.
- In Japan, Typhoon Nanmadol hit Kyushu, the country's southernmost main island. At least two people were killed and dozens more injured in the storm, which moved northward over Honshu. Wind gusts of over 145 mph and heavy rainfall caused at least one landslide and damaged homes and businesses. We have been in touch with the ELCA's global personnel in Japan.
- In Papua New Guinea, a 7.7 magnitude earthquake hit on Sep. 11, with ensuing aftershocks. At least three people died, and many buildings and roads were impacted. There is a strong Lutheran presence in the impacted area, including a Lutheran nursing school connected to the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Papua New

- Guinea (ELCPNG) that was damaged in the earthquake. We have been in contact with the ELCPNG to discuss a possible response.
- In Pakistan, the summer monsoon flooding is causing a widespread humanitarian crisis. The flooding has killed 1,500 people and up to 7 million people may be displaced. Lutheran Disaster Response is contributing to an ACT Alliance appeal that addresses the needs of flooded communities. Through the appeal, local partners will provide food, temporary shelter and bedding, rebuilding materials and psychosocial support.

These are just the disasters that made the biggest headlines. There are countless smaller disasters that don't make the news. With your gifts to the <u>Lutheran Disaster Response general fund</u>, we can respond to as many as possible – whenever and wherever they strike.
