Mark your calendar and plan to attend the ALRC City Council Candidate Forum, 7 PM, October 13, 2020. This event will be held at the Heritage Park Equestrian Center Outside. The wearing of masks and proper social distancing will be requested.

Please note that all District 1 and 4 Council Candidates are being invited. Each Candidate will be given 5 minutes to make an opening statement about their background, and political platform.

Council Candidates will be asked questions regarding issues important to the equestrian and trail use community; questions regarding park trail funding long and short term, city general plan updates, preserving and enhancing trail master plan, funding/repairing trail storm damage to Almond trail and/or



infrastructure damage to Heritage Park bridges on the west side connecting trails. These are the questions and issues most important to those who use our beautiful trails and enjoy a healthy outdoor lifestyle.

Next, after the panel discussion, we will take a 10-minute break, with refreshments and those in attendance may also ask additional questions of the individual candidates.

The evening will end with each candidate present given 5 minutes to make concluding statements. Candidates may include responses to questions the public has asked during the break or address a question which was not drawn for that candidate during the panel discussion.

Plan on attending and pass along this information to friends and neighbors. All those living in Rancho Cucamonga enjoy the benefits of our trail system and we must insure it is a top priority for those elected to represent us as future decisions are made at the local government level.

### GATOR UPDATE

As many of you are aware, 2 years ago ALRC purchased a used electric gator from the city to use for maintenance of Heritage Park Equestrian Center. Due to some mechanical issues, that gator became unsafe to use, so it remained parked. In an effort to keep costs down for repair, the ALRC Board approved the purchase of another Gator from the city to use as parts. The Gator was purchased mid September and immediately evaluated for useful parts. It was determined that the new parts gator was both cosmetically and structuraly more sound than the existing ALRC Gator. Using parts from both, a new gator was made and is now usable at the park.

**EQUESTRIAN TRANSLATION** The Gator was lame in the left front and had no impulsion, so the gator was put out to pasture. Then a team performed surgery, and after a short rest period and some exercise the gator is now sound.



## OCTOBER RIDE **PUMPKIN ROCK TRAIL • NORCO. CA**
