SHOCKER IN ANN ARBOR

Just when you think you've seen it all, the end of the Michigan-Michigan State game proves that there are still some surprises left to witness. Michigan was 10 seconds away from victory when Michigan punter Blake O'Neill, fumbled the 4th down snap. He complicated things further when he panicked as opposed to just falling on the ball, and with the swarming MSU defenders all around him and with all the chaos, somehow the ball ended up in the hands of Michigan State's Jalen Watts-Jackson, who returned it 38 yards into the endzone as the clock ran out. The Spartan fans in Michigan Stadium were ecstatic, while all of the Michigan fans sat there stunned. An absolutely amazing finish.

Some of the other highlights from this past weekend included LSU's narrow 35-28 win over Florida. With the game tied at 28, Les Miles called a fake field goal that was executed to perfection to give LSU the 7 point lead and the win. JT Barrett played most of the 2nd half for Ohio State and the Buckeye offense looked very efficient with him taking the snap in Ohio State's 38-10 win over Penn State. That was Urban Meyer's 20th consecutive victory which is his 4th such streak (see page 7). Notre Dame beat USC 41-31 in a very entertaining game that keeps the Irish in the mix for the playoffs. Alabama had 3 interceptions returned for touchdowns in their 41-23 win over Texas A&M. Once again the Aggies had trouble stopping a powerful rushing attack which must be corrected. Baylor scored at least 60 points for the 5th consecutive game as they cruised to a 62-37 win over West Virginia. Oklahoma took out their frustrations on Kansas State after their loss to Texas the week before, as the Sooners blasted the Wildcats 55-0. Memphis improved to 6-0 with an impressive 37-24 victory over Ole Miss. Expect to see the Tigers head coach, Justin Fuente mentioned for several high profile jobs after the regular season concludes due to the way he has turned that Memphis program around. Iowa is also sitting at 7-0 after blasting Northwestern 40-10. When looking at the Hawkeyes schedule, it's possible that they could go into the Nebraska game on November 27th undefeated. Stanford looked very good once again in their win over UCLA. RB Christian McCaffrey is a legitimate Heisman Trophy candidate for the Cardinal. Rutgers over came a 25 point deficit to stun Indiana 55-52.

On October 10th, Steve Spurrier, Steve Sarkisian and Randy Edsall were head coaches in the SEC, Pac-12 and Big Ten respectively. Today none are roaming the sidelines. Spurrier retired, Sarkisian was fired due to off-the-field issues, while Edsall was let go due to on-the-field failures. These are the most recent jobs that have opened up, but they most definitely will have company when the 2015 season concludes. There are several rumors of firings, resignations and retirements flowing all across college football. There will be coaches moving from one job to another, coordinators that will get the chance to prove themselves as head coaches and, of course, rumors of Jon Gruden and Chip Kelly coming to a campus near you. It looks like college football's "crazy season" has started early this year.

AROUND THE NATION

Northwestern (5-2) is at Nebraska (3-4) The Huskers look like a better team than Northwestern right now, even though their record doesn't reflect it. Penn State (5-2) vs Maryland (2-4) in Baltimore. Nittany Lions RB Saquon Barkley rushed for 194 yards against Ohio State. If he has a similar performance vs the Terrapins, it should be enough to propel Penn State to the win. Duke (5-1) goes to Lane Stadium to take on Virginia Tech (3-4). The Blue Devils could be in for a real battle vs the Hokies. Tennessee (3-3) has had 2 weeks to prepare for Alabama (6-1) as the Vols try to upset the Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa. Texas A&M (5-1) is at Ole Miss (5-2). Both the Aggies and Rebels will try to bounce back after suffering losses last week. California (5-1) is at UCLA (4-2). The Bruins try to rebound from their loss to Stanford against a Cal team that's had 2 weeks to prepare for this game. Washington (3-3) goes to Palo Alto to take on Stanford (5-1) in an important Pac-12 North Division Game. Utah (6-0) travels to the LA Coliseum to take on USC (3-3). The Trojans are much better than their record indicates and it would not be a shock if the Trojans were to upset the Utes. Texas Tech (5-2) is at Oklahoma (5-1). The Sooners looked very good last week but Texas Tech is a dangerous opponent.

CLEMSON AT MIAMI (FL)



The undefeated Clemson Tigers (6-0) travel down to Sun Life Stadium to take on the upset minded Miami Hurricanes (4-2) in a key ACC game that will be televised nationally on ABC at 12:00 Noon EDT.

Clemson QB, Deshaun Watson, passed for 420 yards in the win over Boston College and he seems to get better and better every week. If he continues to perform like this, he will end up in New York City for the Heisman Trophy presentation in December. That being said, the Clemson rushing attack is still underperforming and it's important that they get it going.

Miami, QB Brad Kaaya looks to be the real deal but it seems there are always a couple of throws that leave you scratching your head. If he can cut down on the mistakes, Miami can play with Clemson.

Miami leads the all-time series 6-3. In games played in Miami, the series is tied 3-3. Since Miami joined the ACC in 2004, the Tigers and Hurricanes have played 4 games with each team winning twice. Amazingly, 3 of those 4 games have gone to overtime. Miami is playing for pride and for Al Golden's job while Clemson is playing to keep their undefeated season intact, playing to stay on top of the ACC Atlantic Division standings and playing to be 1 of the 4 teams in the Playoffs. STRANGE DECISION FROM THE MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE IN 1964

Back in 1964, the old Missouri Valley Conference (which stopped sponsoring football following the 1985 season) did something that no conference had done before or since. That season, the Missouri Valley Conference wanted every school to play 4 league games, but both Cincinnati and Louisville had only scheduled 3 conference games that season. The conference came up with a unique solution. The conference games vs North Texas State for both Cincinnati & Louisville would count as 1 conference game for North Texas State but as 2 conference games for Cincinnati & Louisville. The Bearcats won their game with North Texas State 27-6 so Cincinnati was rewarded with 2 conference wins in one day while North Texas State received the normal 1 conference loss. The game between Louisville and North Texas State was won by the Eagles 22-0 and it counted as 1 conference win for North Texas State but counted as 2 conference losses for Louisville. Cincinnati ended up winning all 3 games they actually played vs Missouri Valley Conference opponents but their conference record was listed as 4-0-0. Louisville, on the other hand went 0-3-0 vs MVC schools but their "official" conference record went in the books as 0-4-0. Below are the official standings of the Missouri Valley Conference in 1964 and the games when Cincinnati and Louisville played North Texas State.

OHIO STATE & FLORIDA STATE ON IMPRESSIVE REGULAR SEASON CONFERENCE WINNING STREAKS

With their victories this past Saturday, both Ohio State and Florida State extended their impressive regular season conference winning streaks. The Buckeyes have now won 27 straight games in the regular season vs Big Ten foes while the Seminoles have won 25 consecutive regular season games vs ACC opponents. We put an emphasis the term "regular season" because Ohio State actually lost to Michigan State in the 2013 Big Ten Championship game. Urban Meyer has actually won 28 of the 29 games vs Big Ten opponents if you count the 1 loss and 1 win in the Big Ten Championship Games. FSU on the other hand won their final 5 conference games in 2012, won all 8 in 2013, all 8 in 2014 and are 4-0 thus far in the ACC in 2015. Florida State has also won the ACC Championship Games the past 3 years, so if you include those wins, FSU has actually won 28 straight games vs ACC opponents. Below we list the all-time longest regular season conference winning streaks in major college football history.
