

#### THE JOY OF WAITING

A desert, a parched land, and a steppe are images that project experiences of lifelessness, emptiness, and inadequacies. These experiences are at the root of the human conditions of hopelessness, depression, and eventually death. Isaiah invited the Israelites, who were at that time experiencing the pain of exile in Babylon, to fan into flame their hope in the expected Messiah, for surely he will come to their rescue. At the coming of the Messiah, they will experience unthinkable and unimagined turn-around in the momentary sorrowful situation. The Messiah will cause the barren and dry lands to produce food and medicine for the nourishment and healing of the people.

This prophecy is once more pronounced into our life on this *Gaudete* Sunday, when the Church invites us to rejoice. Rejoice because the barrenness, the dryness, the emptiness of our life will be made fruitful, graceful, and filled. However, as we wait for this prophecy to come true, we need to expel from our mind and heart the spirits of despair and fear, and fill them with the spirit of hope and patience. Remember, nothing is impossible with our God of Possibilities, who creates all things out of nothing. It is important for us to be mindful of the fact that some barren, dry, and empty situations in our life may not be turned around. However, God can work through them to lift us up, turn us around and place our feet upon the Solid Rock. Christ Jesus.

#### THE MEANING OF GAUDETE SUNDAY

In many places in the Catholic world, one of the Advent candles is pink in color. The pink candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent. It reflects the rejoicing and joyful spirit within the liturgy of the day. It is in that same spirit of rejoicing and joy that this third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word which means rejoice. Rejoice because the Lord, our Redeemer is no longer said to be coming, but that the Lord, our Redeemer is nigh, and as such, our salvation is nigh. In our everyday interpretation, Gaudete Sunday could be said to be "a day off from the sober mood of the Advent season;" "a day to brighten up in rejoicing in anticipation of the joy that the coming of expected Messiah will bring to us." Hence, the pink candle we lit on the third Sunday of Advent signifies the brightening of our hope and joy as we celebrate the very nearness of the coming of our Redeemer.



# Dolores Blanch Lewis Bishop Sister Mary Jose', OSP

Dolores Blanch Lewis, her Christian name, was born April 7, 1930, in Prichard, Alabama. She was one of 12 children, born to Mr. & Mrs. John and Anna Mary Lewis. They were members of St. James Major Catholic Church. Ms. Lewis received the Blessed Sacrament of Baptism at St. James Major Catholic Church December 31, 1932.

The Lewis family later joined Most Pure Heart of Mary Church, where Dolores received the Blessed Sacraments of Confirmation, Holy Eucharist, and Penance. She attended Heart of Mary School. She sang in the choir, and learned to play the

Upon graduating Heart of Mary in 1947, Ms. Lewis attended Spring Hill College and Webster College. She entered the Oblate Sisters of Providence (OSP) as a postulant September 5, 1947, and received the name, Sister Mary Jose'. She received her First Profession on August 15, 1950. Following this transition, Sister Jose' entered Notre Dame Teacher Training and performed Motherhouse duties.

Sister Jose' first taught third grade at St. Augustine School in Washington, DC. In 1952, she taught grades 3 and 4 at St. Joseph School in Mobile. In 1956, she received her Final Vows.

In fall 1962, Sister Jose' taught at St. Philip School in New Orleans. In 1963, she returned to St. Joseph and the St. Joseph Convent, and furthered her educational training at Spring Hill College. Later that year, she traveled to the OSP Motherhouse in Baltimore due to illness. She was eventually assigned to Holy Cross Catholic School.

From 1966 to 1970, Sister Jose' taught grades 7 and 8 at St. Gerard School in Aiken, South Carolina. She requested, and received, final dispensation of vows July 8, 1971, and returned to Mobile.

Mrs. Lewis held several jobs and later married briefly. She ultimately re-entered the education arena. Former St. Joseph School student and Mobile County Public School System Administrator, Mrs. Marva Hall Carter, hired Ms. Lewis Bishop as Reading Coach at Morningside Elementary School, where Mrs. Carter is Principal. She worked there for several years before she retired.
