3.	God's wonderful promises don't do us any good unless wethem.
	The children of Israel were given a promise but they didn't believe the promise. Think of a seed. When planted in the ground a seed can grow up into a wonderful plant and bring forth much fruit. But if that seed is kept on your kitchen table or on some other hard surface, it will never do anyone any good. God's Word is like that seed. God's promises must be planted deep in our hearts and we must believe what God says.
	Suppose your Father says, "I will put \$20.00 into your coat pocket so that you will have money to spend in town." If you do not believe this, then you could go to town and the money would do you no good, because you cannot spend something that you do not believe you have. The smart thing to do would be to believe what your Father said, reach into your pocket, grab the money and use it wisely!
