Honored Guest National Garden Club President, **Sandra Robinson** will be attending the convention and speaking at the Installation Banquet on Monday. "Leap into Action" is the theme for her administration.

Dr. Alex X. Niemiera is an Associate Professor at the Dept. of Horticulture and Assistant Dean of Academic Instruction at VA Tech. He has spent the last 24 years teaching students about the many aspects of horticulture at Virginia Tech, conducting research on container-



grown plants, and sharing his knowledge with horticulture industry personnel and the gardening public of Virginia. He will speak about "Our Native Sun Worshipers: Native Trees ~ Facts and Lore", which will directly be in relation to the "Planting Trees for Tomorrow" endeavor.



Paige Canfield is the owner of Sumner B. Designs which is a boutique flowers firm specializing in fresh floral design. Paige started her professional career in the municipal bond industry. She made a big leap to the creative world in 2003 when she secured an intern-

ship in Washington, DC. in the floral shop at the Blair House. After floral training, she began to decorate for holiday house tours, small weddings and events and home tabletop decor. Her topic for the convention is "The Life and Times of Florist Constance Spry- Queen Elizabeth's Coronation and Wedding Flowers".

David Pippin is the owner of David Pippin Inc. He graduated from Virginia Tech with a Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Education. He is a facilitator & consultant for Virginia Agriculture in the Classroom, providing teachers with lessons to help students understand where our food and fibers



are grown. He is also an adjunct professor in the Horticulture Department at J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College. David is currently the floral designer for The Executive Mansion of Virginia.



Al Brockwell, owner and operator of Flora Culture, AIFD, CFD, is a member of the American Institute of Floral Designers. He has traveled the world learning "the art of floral design" with other artists. Al is a lecturer, an instructor at Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden, and a

traveling show designer. All has been in the floral business for over 30 years, winning numerous awards for his work. He considers himself a freelance designer. Enjoy seeing David and All create floral designs using the same flowers with different results.

David Roos has a gardening design and consulting practice, worked in nurseries, wrote a newspaper column and gives garden lectures. He received his design training at the New York Botanical Garden's Landscape Design certificate program in New York City. Mr. Roos' gar-



dening philosophy emphasizes a hands-on approach and common sense practicality. He will speak about "Gardening in the 21 Century".

BOOK REVIEW

Bringing the Garden Indoors



By P. Allen Smith

Many of you are already familiar with some of the books written by P. Allen Smith. Allen is best known for his garden designs using mixtures of colors, plants and containers in a relaxed "homey" atmosphere. P. Allen Smith will be one of the speakers at the NGC Convention in Richmond, VA, May 16-21 and his books will be available for purchase. His engaging personality and enthusiasm for gardening are inspiring.

This book, *Bringing the Garden Indoors*, presents various ideas on how to bring the beautiful blooms and plant material from your garden into your home to enjoy in other ways.

Allen starts with the front entrance and using a variety of containers and plants sets the stage for what is to come inside the home, always changing with the seasons. He carries his themes into the foyer and then proceeds through the home with ideas for the living room, bedroom and bath. He also has suggestions for outdoor dining.

Using collections of "finds" from antique shops, flea markets and many other places, he crafts ways of designing a dining table arrangement, something to fill a nook, a citrus tree in the kitchen or any other place to bring the outside garden in. However, he also states that if you don't have a garden, you can purchase flowers at the super market and still enjoy these ideas.

Allen devotes a section of the book on interesting ways of growing and showing paper whites and also forcing blooms in the early spring. The book ends with a resource guide and other suggested reading on the subject.

The photography throughout this book is very good showing both blooms and plants in vivid color and technics in an easy to understand way.

Remember, plants are healthy for you, so why not surround yourself with interesting and creative ideas for adding colorful blooms and plants in your home.

Other books by P. Allen Smith: Colors for the Garden; Garden Home, Creating a Garden for Everyday Living; Container Gardens; Living in the Garden Home, Connecting the Seasons; and Seasonal Recipes.

NEW CULTIVARS

Check out some new plants for 2017 such as *Hosta* 'Branching Out' - a breeding breakthrough from Plant Delights Nursery.

Ann Meisoll of Stanges Nursery recommends Mirage Hot Pink autumn sage (*Salvia greggii* 'Balmirhope') and *Pentas* BeeBright mix. She also likes "Mad Hatter' pepper and 'Patio Baby' eggplant. For outstanding flowering shrubs she recommends Diamond Rouge hydrangea (*H. paniculata* 'Rendia') and 'Cayenne' dogwood (*Cornus amomum* 'Cayenne').

Butch Whitton of Campbell & Ferrara in Alexandria says he has "always been a fan of the many *Heuchera* varieties. The leaf colors get more interesting with every new introduction. This year, two new varieties, 'Forever Purple' (shown above) and 'Grape Soda' bring more breadth to this shade— and sun-loving versatile plant."


