



UL Specifications and ETL Listings

Meter-Treater's AC Power Surge Protection Devices (SPD) products have been tested to meet the UL 1449 3rd Edition requirements. This testing was performed by ETL Semko, an OSHA approved Nationally Recognized Testing Laboratory (NRTL). ETL Semko supports and enforces the same UL specifications and meets all the criteria set forth by OSHA. They also will perform periodic inspections of our manufacturing facility to ensure ongoing compliance and product integrity.

The difference between UL Specifications and the UL Listed Mark

The UL Specifications are not directly affiliated with any particular testing laboratory. The UL Listed Mark is not the only Mark that signifies that a product has been tested to the UL Specifications.

All Nationally Recognized Testing Laboratories (NRTL) use the UL Specifications in their testing procedures for certification and listing. These laboratories are required to be 100% compliant with the specifications outlined by OSHA and ANSI (American National Standards Institute).

UL Listing Marks vs. ETL Listing Marks

Marks listed on products define which Nationally Recognized Testing Laboratory (NRTL) performed the compliance tests. Whether the product has an ETL Listed Mark or an UL Listed Mark, the same UL specifications and requirements have been met. Neither mark is better than the other because the UL Specifications are the same.

Many well-known companies use the ETL Listed Mark on their products. Some of these companies include AT&T, Dell, Ericsson, General Electric, Panasonic and Philips.
