



Houghs Neck GARDEN CLUB

On November 7th, the Houghs Neck Garden Club will host Sam Monkhern, Grounds Manager and Director of the Babcock Auditorium at Eastern Nazarene College. Monkhern will speak to the club "Functional Landscaping," on highlighting the importance of using plants that work together, are functional, and can grow in their specific environment as well as the need for bees, insects, and birds. He will also tell us about the Babcock Arboretum, an arboretum here in Quincy with redwood trees! The meeting will be held in the MWRA Community Room at Nut Island, 2nd floor, 149 Sea Street, starting at 7pm with refreshments and a brief business meeting followed by the program at 7:30pm.

As mentioned in the July issue of the Bulletin, the HNGC was awarded a Quincy Community Preservation Grant for the improvement of the landscaping around the World War II Memorial on the corner of Manet Ave and Sea Street. Work funded by this grant, with Ralph Ames as landscaper, will begin in October. Meanwhile the City has been very helpful. Trees were removed at our request by the Park Department. The Water department put in a water spigot for us and the Traffic, Parking and Lighting department put in a new spotlight.





Dear Houghs Neck Residents,

It was great to see so many people from the neighborhood last month at Chowdafest, which we had perfect weather for this year. Thank you to everyone at the Houghs Neck Community Council, volunteers, restaurants, home cooks, the band and voters for 'best chowda' for their great work in putting together another successful event.

The general election is coming up on November 6th. If you have not registered to vote yet, you must register by October 17th. If you are not available to vote on November 6th, you can apply for an absentee ballot or participate in early voting. You can get voter registration and absentee ballot forms from the Secretary of State's website at www.sec.state.ma.us/ele/. Early voting starts on October 22nd, Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 4:30pm at the Richard J. Koch Recreation Department, 1 Merrymount Parkway. In addition, there is early voting being held on Saturday, October 27th at North Quincy High School, from 8:30am to 4:30pm. For more information, you can visit the city website at www.quincyma.gov/govt/depts/city_clerk/election. As always, you can also contact my office directly if you need more information or would like us to print information and mail it to you.

The Joint Committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure has held two hearings since the end of session and we anticipate several more before the end of the calendar year. Although formal sessions have ended, the Legislature continues to pass bills in informal sessions when there is unanimous consent. Legislators can file legislation year round regardless of whether there are formal sessions or not. Under the Legislative Rules, a joint committee must hold a public hearing and recommend an action within 30 days of when the legislation is admitted to the committee. The Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure committee is particularly active as consumer issues are ongoing and we receive a large number of special legislative requests from cities and towns, known as home rule petitions. This committee reviews municipalities' requests to have additional retail or on-premise liquor licenses beyond the current statutory amounts. These licenses have a market value, so introduction of new licenses can have a dramatic impact on the value of the remainder; we heavily scrutinize this type of legislation as a result to ensure a fair environment for both new and existing businesses.

I was recently awarded the National Association of Government Employees (NAGE) legislator of the year award. This award is given at their national conference with representatives from each local from throughout the United States. This union represents over 22,000 Massachusetts public employees and over 110,000 throughout the country. NAGE is affiliated with Service Employee International Union (SEIU), which has over 2 million members in North America. The annual meeting is held once every four years where they elect their national officers. David Holway, who is originally from Cambridge, was elected to his 5th four-year term as national president. This is an incredible honor to be recognized for my work in the legislature at a national level.

Houghs Neck World War II Memorial

In the spring of 2018, the Houghs Neck Garden Club received a grant through the Community Preservation Act to rehabilitate the landscape around the World War II memorial across from the fire station in Houghs Neck. American Legion Post 380 took care of the site until the Legion sold its building about eight years ago. After that, Nancy Brennan, a teacher at Atherton Hough planted flowers but mowing and other such activities were done on an ad hoc basis. When she retired, she asked the Houghs Neck Garden Club to continue planting flowers. We have been trying to do that for three years, with little success.

As we became more familiar with the site, we realized that it needed much more than planting flowers. The granite monument itself is in excellent condition but the grounds that surround it are not. We applied for a Community Preservation Act grant and we received \$25,000 to revitalize the memorial grounds, a site of about 2,500 square feet with a granite monument.

Houghs Neck Honor Roll

The granite monument was the second memorial on the site. The original, wood-framed memorial from the late 1940s listed the names of more than 500 members of the Houghs Neck community who served in the military during World War II. The wooden memorial, called the Honor Roll, was constructed by and contributed to the community by the Lundin brothers, builders in the Quincy area.

Granite Memorial

In 1952, this memorial was replaced by a granite monument, paid for by the citizens of Houghs Neck. The names that had been on the wooden memorial were printed on a scroll that was placed in a bronze box then buried at the base of the current granite monument. The granite monument is made of Quincy granite from Swingle's quarry set upon three polished bases symbolic of faith, hope and charity. The stone was designed and constructed by C. W. Caniff and Sons at a cost of \$2300 obtained through contributions of Houghs Neck residents. The designer was Roger Gervasi, head of designing for the company. It is of highly desirable, very dark granite, considered by some to be the best monument stone in the world.

Garden Club Project

Our goal for this project is to clean up and replant the site to showcase the monument. Working with the Park Department, we had dead and dying trees removed. The landscaper chosen for this project is Ralph Ames of Ames Landscaping. Working with Ralph, we plan to remove most of the existing plantings and add new ones along the back of the monument to hide the fence and along the walkway leading to the monument to draw the eye to the monument and also to remove and replace the hedge surrounding the site.

Last fall there were discussions on social media on the whereabouts of the wooden memorial. To date it has not been located. However, photos of this memorial exist. Leo Ladas gave us a high resolution photo of the Honor roll, taken by his grandfather, John Louis Ladas who was a World War I vet, the father of two WWII vets and one Korean War vet. Using this photo, we were able to construct a spreadsheet of the 520 names it contained. These names have been engraved on bricks and will be laid down to replace the cement walkway there today creating a link between the wooden memorial and the granite monument. The list of the names will appear in the November Issue of the Houghs Neck Bulletin. Work on the site is expected to start at the beginning of October. In the spring we plan to hold a rededication of the memorial. Stay tuned for more information on this.


