Private, Captain Amos Walbridge's Company Colonel Charles Webb's 2nd Connecticut Regiment

Phineous Manning, Sr. Was born 03 March, 1727 at Hopkinton, Massachussetts. He was a colonial soldier in the French and Indian War. He served under Captain Benjamin Lee and Colonel Elisha Williams from 1746 to 1747 in addition to other short enlistments.

Phineous enlisted as a soldier in the Revolutionary War under Captain Amos Walbridge in Colonel Charles Webb's 2nd Connecticut Regiment. On 29 January, 1777 he enlisted under Colonel Zebulon Butler for a term of three years. His unit was among those at Valley Forge in the winter of 1777 to 1778. He and his unit were also at the Battle of Monmouth in 1778.

Phineous Manning Was known to have has 4 sons that also served in the Revolutionary War. Their names were William, Phineous, Jr., Thomas, and unknown.
