Preschool



Biblical Principles – Principles of honesty, integrity and accountability are taught as a foundation for all relationships. Bible stories are taught each day to begin the day.

Ages - LCS preschool cares for children from two years old until they are ready for Kindergarten.

Licensing Requirements - Our school strictly adheres to the county licensing regulations for preschool.

Class Size - Classes are kept small in order to maintain a good teacher/student ratio. (two year olds – 10 to 1, three year olds – 15 to 1, and four year olds 20 to 1) Most of our classes are kept at an even lower ratio.

Dress Code – Tennis shoes with tie or Velcro closure must be worn for safety reasons. No boots, sandals, or flip-flops are permitted. (see handbook for complete details regarding dress code)

Snacks -Morning and afternoon snacks are given to preschool children. Snacks include juice, water or milk and healthier type snacks low in sugar. (see sample menu)

Potty Training -Children must be potty trained (out of pull ups) by the time they are three years old in order to continue to attend LCS. Teachers work with our two year olds to ensure that they are trained by the time they are three.

Hot lunches are available through Saltwater Catering for \$3.95 a day. (see menu) If a child brings a cold lunch, we recommend that you use a freezer cold pack for food safety.

Tuition is set at an annual rate, but can be paid either monthly or weekly. Because tuition is a prorated annual fee, there are partial weeks when full tuition payments are due. (example – Thanksgiving week)

Vacations- Preschool is closed for the week of July 4th as well as additional days at Christmas, this allows for maintenance in the classrooms and buildings.

Curriculum- LCS uses the A Beka curriculum. Our children begin learning their letters and numbers on day one. They also have weekly music and Spanish classes.

Communication- is emphasized at each grade level. Weekly letters are sent home informing parents of what will be taught that week. The two's receive daily notes telling parents how their child did that day. Three's and Four's receive notes three times a week. Progress reports for all ages go home every nine weeks.

Discipline – Consistent consequences for unacceptable behavior are administered with love and firmness. Redirection and time outs are the main forms of discipline.

What to Bring - Two-year-olds must have **two changes of clothes, 2 pairs of socks and 1 extra pair of tennis shoes. Untrained 2's must bring 5 diapers daily.** Three – Five-year-olds need **one complete change of clothes and 1 extra pair of tennis shoes.** All preschoolers need a small blanket for nap time. A **small** pillow and **small** nap pal may also be brought.
