Did you know that 90% of 4th through 8th graders report being victims of bullying? A percentage that large is almost unbelievable, but unfortunately, it is the harsh truth. As a result, victims of bullying exhibit a range of responses and behaviors including: low self-esteem, difficulty controlling anger, difficulty in trusting others, lack of assertiveness, misplaced aggression, and isolation. We know this and that is WHY we do what we do. Community Now works with children in local elementary schools through a Student Leadership Program. Our goal? To instill mental wellness, self-love, self-acceptance, empowerment, leadership, and teamwork within these thriving young children.

By now, you keep hearing about our Student Leadership Teams and how amazing they are; how driven and determined they are; how influential to their peers they have become and are continuing to become; how much we admire their strive for bettering themselves and their community. We can't stop talking about them! They are so important to us because in the short amount of time we have been with them, they have truly developed within themselves and towards others.

Before we went on break, our youth overcame adversity and labels. They engaged in activities that made them realize how truly wonderful and unique each and every one of them is. The labels people give them do not define who they are. The adversity that stands in their way does not limit their capability to grow and overcome hardships. 
Did you know Walt Disney, creator of Disney characters, of Disneyland, was fired from a newspaper for "lacking imagination" and having "no original ideas?"
