



Family Guidelines for Kelly's Kidz Grants for AA Driving School

Purpose: To provide funding for drivers education training for physically impaired teens/young adults that will have access to use an adapted vehicle.

The requirements to be eligible to apply for a Kelly's Kidz driving grant is as follows:

1. Must have a referral into the program from the Doctor primarily treating the diagnosis.
2. Must have a physical impairment
3. Within 6 weeks of completion of training hours. Family must demonstrate access to equipment and/or modifications outlined in the recommendations from A&A's evaluation OR demonstrate a plan to acquire.

The process to obtain financial granting is as follows:

- Once referred by Doctor: Parent/Patient is responsible for filling out application forms for the grant as well as the Kelly's Kidz Marketing Release. Once the forms are completed they can either be submitted via email to kellyskidz@sbcglobal.net or mailed to Kelly's Kidz, 48537 Antique Rd, Canton, MI 48187.
- Parent/patient upon approval of grant, you are agreeing to follow all recommendations for instructions/training outlined in your personalized evaluation. Parent/patient will finance and obtain any equipment/modifications to a vehicle to allow the grantee to use the vehicle on regular bases and to assure retention of driving skills.
- With the application, a Di-4P form must be filled out by the patients current physician and a RX written stating, "Driver Evaluation" the original form and RX must be submitted for initial evaluation by A&A driving to determine ability to drive and estimated cost of training.

Attention: Parent(s) guardian(s) Do Not send the completed Di-4P form to Michigan Department of State Driver Assessment and Appeal Division until instructed by A&A driving school.

***If the teen takes a High School Drivers Education course (which will not be paid through the Kelly's Kidz Grant) they must coordinate with A&A to assure that they are able to complete the 6 hours of road training within 3 weeks of completing classroom instruction. (This is a State of Michigan Requirement)*
