

Families and the Gospel

Mk 13:24-32, Today's gospel teaches us UNCERTAINTY is normal. There are some things in life which "no one knows...only the Father." Marriage and parenting are full of uncertainty for like the fig tree in the gospel, the people we love grow and change.

Thanksgiving: As you prepare for Thanksgiving, look back on this year to all the moments God visited your family in unexpected blessings, or disasters avoided, or kindness and compassion received. Realize and give thanks for "The Lord is with you."

Liturgical Reflection

The body of the deceased is honored throughout the funeral rites. Holy water reminds the assembly of the saving waters of baptism. Its use reminds the living of the deceased's baptism when they died to sin and were claimed for Christ into eternity. Incense is used during the funeral rites as a sign of honor to the body of the deceased, which through baptism became the temple of the Holy Spirit. A white pall is placed over the casket of the deceased as a reminder of the garment they once wore over their body at baptism. Order of Christian Funerals, 1998, Numbers 36, 37, and 38. (2018, Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown, Liturgy Office.)

Thanksgiving Every Day

We're certainly no strangers to the idea of thanksgiving. After all, our biggest national holiday centers on the theme. Even the word Eucharist, central to the Christian faith, translates into "thanksgiving." We simply need to take what we do

one Thursday each year and every Sunday and bring it into our day-to-day routines.

One of the easiest and most effective ways to do this is to keep a gratitude journal. It doesn't have to be fancy; a spiral notebook will do. Keep it somewhere central so you won't forget about it, and make it a habit to list things you're thankful for throughout your day, week, year. You can do it as the Spirit moves you or have a set plan—for example, five things jotted down before bed each night. The goal is simply to start taking notice of the blessings in plain sight.

Service and charity are bound up in this practice of gratitude. When we become more aware of our blessings, we tend to become more aware of the suffering or want around us, prompting us to seek out opportunities to share with others, whether it is through prayer or almsgiving or other efforts to demonstrate in concrete ways our deep gratitude to God.
