Parents,

Talk to your child as you go about your daily routine. No baby talk. Talk about what you are doing. Give simple directions. Make your child feel important to you.

Studies show that a 3-year-old child who has regular conversations with their parents have a higher IQ scores than a 3-year-old child who experience less communication with their parents.

Children tend to value what their parents value. If your children see you reading, then they are more likely to want to read and enjoy doing it.

Read to your children from birth. Choose simple books

and read to them with expressions. Point to the pictures as you read. Eventually, your child will be reading the pictures to you.

Reading to your child during their early years, will plant a love for reading different



types of books. The child who loves books does better in school than the child who does not love books.

Praise your child for trying. For example, say something like, "Good Job! You tried really hard! I'm sorry you didn't quite get it this time, but I am proud of you for trying. Next time you'll do it."

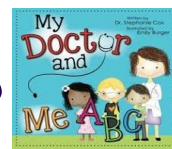
In addition to reading a book, healthy eating plays a big factor in a child's school readiness goals. The right foods are essential to a child's healthy eating habits. Children need plenty of fruits, vegetables, and home cooked meals. Family meals time is a great way to strengthen parent and child's interaction. Eating together regularly gives family members a chance to talk to each other and to spend quality time bonding together.

LOOKERS-Learn best by watching

- *They are fairly quiet.
- *Enjoy drawing & crafts
- *Like to play alone

LISTENERS-Learn best by hearing instructions, descriptions.

- *They talk a lot
- *Remember songs & stories easily
- *Like group play

MOVERS-Learn best when using their hands or moving about.

- *They find it hard to sit still
- *Enjoy wheeled toys, climbing & jumping
- *Like active group play.
