Comrades and Friends!

Happy New Year 2023!!!! Welcome 2023! I am so happy 2022 is behind us! A big “thank you” to those of our Post who put the New Years Eve Party together and to those who attended. Post events are always tiresome projects and NYE is especially difficult.

2023 Resolutions. Tradition requires that we make resolutions about the new year. I suggest that you join me with the following commitments among others:

1. You will **volunteer** in the Post kitchen at least TWICE during 2023.
2. You will **attend** the monthly membership meeting of your American Legion family group.
3. You will make a significant **monetary donation** to at least one Veteran charity helping disabled Vets such as the DAV, Paralyzed Veterans of America, Tunnels2Towers, Fisher House, Wounded Warriors, etc.
4. You will **visit** the Post on Friday night at least ONCE EACH MONTH.
5. You will **recruit** at least one new member into the Post.

Preamble, Clause 6. As I promised in last Bugle issue, each issue I will review one of the ten clauses (pledges) of the Legion Preamble that we recite at each Legion function. Last issue I reviewed the fifth clause. The sixth one is “**TO INCULCATE A SENSE OF INDIVIDUAL OBLIGATION TO THE COMMUNITY, STATE AND NATION.**”

Always interested in building a better nation, the founders of the American Legion believed that such building must start first with the individual in his own community. So they made it one of the cardinal principles of the Legion to inculcate that sense of personal obligation to the community, state and nation into the individual citizen. That means educating the citizen-young, old and future-in his and her responsibility to be active in making the hometown a better place in which to live, in discharging the duty of voting in elections, respecting our laws, contributing to charities and to blood banks. The word "inculcate" means "to impress by frequent admonitions" and "to enforce by frequent repetitions." Like the duties themselves, the reminders that they remain to be carried forward are never finished.

Finally, remember our mutual commitment to the Preamble to the American Legion Constitution and the Legion’s Four Pillars (Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation; National Security; Americanism; Children & Youth); and most of all remember our commitment to our National Constitution and Country though if you are a veteran, that reminder is normally not necessary.

Post 132 continues to operate ever mindful of any and all legalities. Should you become aware of some potential legal problem for the Post, please inform me at your earliest opportunity so it can be addressed. If I can be of any help to you, feel free to contact me 24/7/365.

STORIES FROM THE 1917 WALL



Lynn Best Wallace was born on May 15, 1896 in Missouri, the fifth of eight children born to farmer James Wallace and his wife Margaret Best Wallace. The Wallace family relocated from Missouri to Orange sometime between 1900 and 1910.

By 1917, 21-year-old Lynn was working as a merchant at his older brother's record store, Wallace Music, located on the Glassell side of the Orange Masonic Temple (where Pandor Café is today). In June that year, two months after the U.S. entered World War I, Lynn was summoned to the draft board.

His first day in the Army was March 6, 1918. We weren't able to find much information about his deployments and whether or not he served abroad, but we do know he was honorably discharged on February 21, 1919, three months after the end of WWI.

By 1924, Lynn had married Henrietta Dasque, was working as a bookkeeper and raising a family. The Wallaces' first daughter Marie was born that year, and their second and final child, daughter Barbara Jean, was born in 1927.

You could say Lynn was a joiner. He was an active member of the Orange Lions, the Orange Masons, the Orange Elks and of course, the American Legion. In 1926 he was elected to the Post 132 executive committee, and led the Post's sponsorship of a city basketball league.



WALLACE, Lynn Best age 91; died July 19, 1987. Father of Marie Thayer and Barbara Willsey; grandfather of 6; great-grandfather of 8. He was a retired Orange County Clerk and a long-time resident of Orange.

Friends may call at the mortuary Tuesday, July 21, from 2 to 8 pm. Services Wednesday, 11 am at Waverley Church, Santa Ana. Interment in Fairhaven Memorial Park, Santa Ana. Assisting the family, Shannon-Donagan Chapel (714/997-1234).

By 1927, Lynn was working at the Citrus Tire & Rubber Company, a Goodyear Tire dealer at 118 W. Chapman St (where Bosscat

Kitchen is now). An active member of the Post, he was elected to the finance committee in 1928, vice commander in 1930, and eventually Commander in 1931. He's one of a few people who are seen on the clubroom's 1917 wall and the Commander wall.

Lynn's civic life started in 1930 when he was hired for the 1930 census. By 1938 he was serving as the OC Deputy County Clerk. By 1957 he had been elected to Orange County Clerk. After 31 years of duty with the county, Lynn retired in 1963.

He enjoyed post-retirement life for 24 years. When he was 83, his wife Henrietta passed away. Seven years later, he joined her on July 19, 1987 at the age of 91. The Wallaces are interred at Fairhaven Memorial Park. At the time of his death, he had six grandchildren and eight great grandchildren. We thank you Private Wallace for your service to our country.
