FROM THE DESK OF FATHER PETER ADOKO-ENCHILL...

GREETINGS

Greetings are very important in my culture. When you meet

someone, you exchange greetings, whether you know the person or not. It is a sign of respect and love. To fail to greet someone you know when you meet the person is a sign that you have something against him or her. He or she very often may ask why you fail to greet him or her. On the other hand, if one fails to respond to a greeting, that also indicates that there is something wrong somewhere. In most cases, the young have to greet the elderly. It happens also that the elderly may greet the young person first and he or she will respond. Very often after greetings, it follows that each will ask about their families and how they are faring. This is especially between two elderly people. Then they will extend their greetings to each other's family. There are different greetings for the time of the day and also during different functions. There are greetings for morning, afternoon and evening. When one is working, there is a special greeting, no matter the time of the day. One working is greeted edwuma! (work), and the one working will respond *edwuma ye* (work is good). One coming from the farm or market or sometimes from a journey is greeted ayekoo (welcome), it can also mean well-done, when someone achieves something great. One who returns from a long journey is greeted akwaaba (welcome).

One cooking is greeted *kitsamu* (hold it), and the response is *medzem*' (I am holding it.) You greet the one eating in the same way, or *nkwa* (life) and the response is **mhm**: this is preferred because the one eating will not open his or her mouth to respond but use the throat in a way that he will not be choked if there is a morsel in his mouth. THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH MARRIAGE UNDER THE PEDEGOGY OF THE LAW

In his mercy God has not forsaken sinful man. The punishments consequent upon sin, "pain in childbearing" and toil "in the sweat of your brow," also embody remedies that limit the damaging effects of sin. After the fall, marriage helps to overcome self-absorption, egoism, pursuit of one's own pleasure, and to open oneself to the other, to mutual aid and to self-giving.

Moral conscience concerning the unity and indissolubility of marriage developed under the pedagogy of the old law. In the Old Testament the polygamy of patriarchs and kings is not yet explicitly rejected. Nevertheless, the law given to Moses aims at protecting the wife from arbitrary domination by the husband, even though according to the Lord's words it still carries traces of man's "hardness of heart" which was the reason Moses permitted men to divorce their wives. Seeing God's covenant with Israel in the image of exclusive and faithful married love, the prophets prepared the Chosen People's conscience for a deepened understanding of the unity and indissolubility of marriage. The books of Ruth and Tobit bear moving witness to an elevated sense of marriage and to the fidelity and tenderness of spouses. Tradition has always seen in the Song of Solomon a unique expression of human love, insofar as it is a reflection of God's love--a love "strong as death" that "many waters cannot quench."
