Principal's Message:

October is Bullying Prevention Month! By Mrs. Little

This October, Villa Park Elementary will observing National Bullying Prevention Month. Throughout the month, we will be participating in school wide activities, including visits by the principal and counselor, Mrs. Keiser, to the classrooms and motivational spirit activities.

Friendship Week: October 10th

Students are encouraged to make a new friend at school by including someone they don't know well in their work or play.

Kindness Week: October 17th

Every student is challenged to say or do something kind for someone at school each day, and encourage others to do the same.

Unity Day: October 19th

Staff and students are encouraged to wear orange to show their support for bullying prevention. www.pacer.org/bullying/nbpm/unity-day.asp

Compliments Week-October 24th

Each student is challenged to give a compliment to at least one other person at school each day.

Bullying Prevention Education Efforts at VPE

Each year Villa Park engages in several educational programs throughout the school year to help students learn positive social skills, and to recognize and respond to bullying. Students are taught that bullying generally falls into four areas and that all of these actions are unacceptable at all school activities:

- Physical—such as hitting or pushing
- Verbal—such as insults or taunts whether spoken or written
- Social—such as deliberately excluding or intimidating
- Cyber—such as embarrassing or mean texts or online posts.

Three things distinguish bullying from routine conflict:

- It is repeated over time
- It is intended to hurt or intimidate the victim
- It generally involves an imbalance of power, either physical or social

If a student should feel bullied at school.

• They are instructed to leave the situation whenever possible (rather than escalating the situation) and report the bullying promptly to an adult.

Most often students will report to a teacher or supervisor, but students may report to any staff member, including the principal, who they may ask to see at any time. Students may also write a written note to the teacher or principal to report the situation.

• It is helpful if students clearly state they feel bullied:

I feel bullied by ______ because

Another student, parent, or staff member may also report the concern.

Whenever a bullying report is made it will be promptly investigated by the principal and parents of all involved students will be informed. Based on the investigation appropriate consequences and monitoring will be put in place to discourage future occurrences.

- In our education we also discuss the importance of not being a passive "bystander", but helping students to leave the situation and report the bullying. This is called being an "up stander"
- Annually as a part of their digital citizenship curriculum at school, students also complete a module on cyber bullying.

Please talk to your children about National Bullying Prevention week and the things that we can do to help make Villa Park and safe and caring community for all!





Orange Unified School District 2016-17 Elementary Monitoring Student Fees, Donations, and Fundraising Guidelines Compliance

Section 5 of Article IX of the State of California Constitution guarantees students a "free public education." The State Supreme Court concluded in the 1984 case of Hartzell v. Connell, "that all educational activities carried on by public school districts, extra-curricular as well as curricula, must be without cost to the students who participate in such activities." This same ruling found that "mandatory fees for participating in such extra-curricular activities as drama, music, and athletic competition were illegal under the State Constitution." Furthermore, they also rejected the argument that "fees could be charged so long as the district waived fees for students who were financially unable to pay." Recent proposed legislation includes reimbursement with interest for any illegally-collected fees as well as a district sanction.

We are extremely fortunate to have such generous Villa Park families who donate supplies, funds and time in order to provide so many wonderful programs and activities for our students. Thank you.

OUSD Schools Are a Great Source of Community Pride

- OUSD is performing at high academic levels with improved test scores on statewide exams in each of the last 7 years
- OUSD has four award-winning comprehensive high schools (Canyon, El Modena, Orange and Villa Park) serving approximately 8,600 students
- Each school offers a college preparatory curriculum and a wide variety of innovative extracurricular programs that prepare students to succeed in college and 21st Century careers
- OUSD's comprehensive high schools have a 96% graduation rate and have been recognized countywide, statewide, and nationally for various programs, awards, and outstanding performance

Aging Classrooms and Facilities

- OUSD's high schools were built between 45 and 64 years ago and are not equipped for 21st Century teaching and learning
- A team of architects, construction managers and engineers recently completed assessments of each high school and identified urgent repairs and upgrades to plumbing, leaky roofs, and school security, fire alarms, and seismic safety systems
- To ensure students develop the needed skills to succeed in the 21st Century economy and have a solid background in science, math and technology, upgrades to science labs, career-training facilities and instructional technology are also needed

Board of Education Voted to Place a Bond on the November 2016 Ballot

- Measure S will cost approx. \$29 per \$100,000 of assessed property value (not market value) annually, or about \$108 per year for the average residence
- Measure S will help the District qualify for state matching funds of up to \$60 million

Specifically, *Measure S* Provides Locally Controlled Funds to:

- Update classrooms and labs to accommodate the career and technology education classes that prepare students for college and well-paying jobs in fields such as health science, engineering, technology and skilled trades
- Repair or replace leaky roofs, old rusty plumbing and faulty electrical systems where needed
- Update instructional technology in the classroom for improved student learning in core subjects such as math and science
- Retrofit older school buildings to protect against the effects of earthquakes and reduce the risk of damage or injury during natural disasters
- Update classrooms, science labs, career-training facilities, libraries and computer systems to keep pace with modern technology
- Modernize aging science labs and equipment

Fiscal Accountability Provisions Required by Law

- Measure S would require a clear system of accountability to ensure funds are spent only on voter-approved projects
- All money raised by Measure S will stay in the District to support students and cannot be taken by the State or used for other purposes
- A specific project list details how funds will be used
- An independent Citizens' Oversight Committee and annual audits will help ensure funds are spent properly
- None of the funds raised can be used for administrators' and teachers' salaries or benefits
- Measure S requires the District to set aside funds for ongoing maintenance to protect taxpayers' investment
- Measure S is written to ensure that each of the four high schools receive an equal share
