Father Hearn celebrates weekday Masses in the Chapel at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday and Fridays. All are invited to attend. <u>THE EASTER SEASON:</u> The Easter season is celebrated during the seven weeks between Easter and Pentecost. These fifty days of Easter are celebrated as **one great Feast Day** known as "the Great Sunday". Through the entire Easter season the triumphant "Alleluia" continues to be heard as we rejoice in the hope of the resurrection.

Today we transition from the Fifty Great Days of Easter to the Solemnity of Pentecost. As Christians, we celebrate Pentecost as the birthday of the Christian Church because it is the day that the disciples received an outpouring of the Holy Spirit and were empowered to begin to share the Good News with others. In the first reading we hear that "when the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place" and that "All of



them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability". Today too, across the world, a myriad of voices, different languages, and many cultural expressions celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. Let us join our voices with that universal Pentecost chorus.

FEAST OF THE VISITATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY May 31



This feast commemorates the meeting between Mary and Elizabeth, both of whom find themselves with child. Each woman experiences an outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Elizabeth's response is to declare Mary and her child blessed; Mary's response is to utter the great hymn of praise, the *Magnificat*. Found in Saint Luke's Gospel (*Luke 1.39-56*), the whole event is one of rejoicing in the wonders that God has done.



ORDINARY TIME

Indinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer "Sundays of Ordinary Time" because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday of Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects". We also may celebrate the parts of Jesus' life that were ordinary, much like our own lives.

MAY 29 - MEMORIAL OF BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH: Mary, the Mother of the Church was instituted by Pope Francis on February 11, 2018 – the 160th anniversary of the apparition of Mary at Lourdes. The title "Mother of the Church" was bestowed on the Blessed Virgin Mary during the Second Vatican Council by Pope Paul VI who declared that "the Mother of God should be further honoured and invoked by the entire Christian people by this tenderest of titles." This movable feast is observed on the Monday following Pentecost and takes precedence over other memorials which may fall on the same day.
