- c) Clans were the basis of society

- f) Strife and rivalry between clans
- g) Cities: Mecca leading commercial center

## II. Muhammad

- a) Born 570 CE in Mecca
- b) Founder of Islam
- c) At 25 married Khadija a wealthy widow
- d) Was a merchant by trade
- e) 610 has his first revelation, met an angel Gabriel
- f) From then on he was considered a prophet of God

## III. Mecca to Medina

- a) In Mecca he was seen as a threat, his followers were attacked
- b) 622 left Mecca and fled to Medina
- c) This flight was known as the Hijra
- d) Organizes the <u>umma</u>, which were Islamic communities that accept him as a messenger
- e) 629 mawali: non-Arab converts to Islam
- f) 630 makes trip back to Mecca
- g) Build mosques
- h) 632 dies, all of Arabia is under Muslim control

  - a) Monotheistic
  - b) Allah the one true god
  - c) Koran or Quran the Islamic holy book
  - d) <u>Shariah</u>: The code of law based on the Koran.
  - e) Five Pillars of Islam
    - a. Faith in Allah

    - c. Fasting: daylight hours of Ramadan
    - d. Give Alms: charity
