CONSECRATED IN LOVE!

Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19; 1Cor. 12:31-13:13; Luke 4: 21-30

The Lord says: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you...They will fight against you but not prevail over you, for I am with you to deliver you..."

Kate is a 20-year-old young lady who is not shy or afraid by any means. One Sunday when Kate returned from Church, her mother asked her what the priest spoke about in his homily. "He spoke about love," she said. "What did he say about love," the mother inquired? "Just the ordinary stuff...but he doesn't seem to understand..." she quipped, indicating she was not interested in talking about it.

Brothers and sisters: Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts: Faith, Hope and Love. The greatest of these, according to St. Paul, is LOVE. The word *love*, probably, has come to be the most used, the most abused, the most misunderstood and the most misused word in our daily interactions and applications. There are millions of meanings and definitions of *love* available to those who care to conduct research on it. Whatever opinions the psychologists and other experts might have, it is important for us to know that *love*, which is a theological virtue, is <u>not</u> a feeling, but an attitude.

Kate is a bitter young lady, who, since her childhood, has had a rough time listening to her parents' advice. In Church, she had heard that not doing the "ordinary things" at home and in school is tantamount to lacking in love. Love is an attitude of patience. It is an attitude of kindness. It is not a feeling, but an attitude of humility: "(Love) is not jealous, it is not pompous, it is not inflated and it is not rude." "Love", as a virtue, "does not seek its own interests." It is not selfish, and it detaches itself from the vices of quick-temperament and bearing of grudges. Love always rejoices with the truth and eschews falsehood and wrongdoing.

Like Jeremiah the Lord had formed you and me and dedicated us before we were born. He has dedicated us to love Him above all things and to love our neighbors as ourselves - to honor and respect our parents and all those in authority, both civil and religious. Christian love is sacrificial. It requires physiological, emotional and spiritual maturity: "When I was a child, I used to talk as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; (but) when I became (an adult), I put aside childish things," such as jealousy, selfishness, impatience, quick-temper, pride and ingratitude. Christian love requires dying to self and living for others. It is a sacrifice of growing from a state of *childishness* into a state of *adultness* in faith.

Jeremiah understood what it meant to love; hence, when the Lord called him, he answered and later graciously suffered persecution and rejection by those he was sent to serve. Our Lord Jesus loved to the end the very people who rejected Him. The Bible tells us that even though "many people spoke highly of Jesus and were amazed at the gracious words that came from His mouth," they still tried to find faults with Him, "...they were all filled with fury...rose up, drove Him out of town..." He knew that "Love is patient...understands all things...bears all things...believes all things...hopes all things and endures all things." Go forth in love, and may today's Scripture passage be fulfilled by your loving interaction with others!
