## "Mapping Narratives Using Fabric, Paint and Thread" Valerie S. Goodwin R.A. – Fiber Artist www.valeriegoodwinart.com

I am a practicing architect, Associate Professor of Architecture and fiber artist whose work has appeared in numerous publications and exhibitions such as "Quilt National", "American Craft Magazine" and "The Quilter's Quarterly Journal". Since 1998, I have been teaching beginning design to students in architecture at Florida A & M University's School of Architecture, using some of the design principles found in both quilting and architecture. Both use shape, composition, ordering systems, color, texture and pattern.

A map is an abstract conception of a place. The person who makes the map has to make choices about what to include as well as what to leave out. Each map is thus a reflection of its maker and the story they want to tell.

This lecture will be about how I use maps to tell the story of a place using fabric, paint and thread.

The focus will be on 3 types of maps:

Personal Narrative Maps

Fictional Map Narratives

Political/Sociological Narratives

Thirty-three Guild members had an opportunity to hear Patricia Belyea's lecture "Alluring World of Japanese Yukata Quilts". Patricia shared highlights from the 2020 Tokyo Quilt Festival, the largest such festival in the world. These magnificent quilts were displayed for a week in a venue the size of a football stadium. Patricia also shared some of her own quilt designs. As a "creative" quilter, she specializes in using hand-dyed yukata quilts and curved piecing in her designs. She and her daughter also sell these fabrics at her Seattle shop, Okan Arts. Information about her fabrics and on-line classes can be found at: okanarts.com.


