Marsh's "Four Years in the Rockies, or, The Adventures of Isaac P. Rose of Shenanago Township, Lawrence County, Pennsylvania."

A brigade of 60 trappers, 20 Delaware and Shawnee, 1 Nez Pierce and many Crow are known to have camped here at the confluence of the Clark's Fork of the Yellowstone and Rocky Fork. Blackfeet also frequented the area engaging in numerous skirmishes.
