BEING A GOOD SHEPHERD

Acts 4: 8-12; Ps. 118: 1, 8-9, 21-23, 26, 28-29; 1 John 3:1-2; John 10:11-18

In Psalm 23, we read: "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters, He restores my soul...Goodness and kindness will follow me all the days of my life, I shall dwell in the house of Lord as long as I live." In today's gospel, Jesus tells you and me: "I am the Good Shepherd."

Have you ever wondered why Jesus calls Himself the "Good Shepherd?" Have you ever wondered why Jesus addresses us and identifies us as "sheep" instead of "cows, bulls, goats, et cetera?" If you have ever noticed a herd of cows, the men guiding them always lead from behind, and the cows never follow their leaders, never recognize the voice of the men who guide them. On the contrary, a shepherd always leads the sheep from the front. He goes in front and the sheep follow behind.

In the Scriptures, we see that men who were called to lead God's people were men who previously were shepherds. Biblical figures like Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses and David were all shepherds before God called them to lead His people to "greener pastures." As shepherds they had the primary responsibility of feeding the sheep – caring for their health and injuries – protecting them from danger. Thus, when the Lord called them to shepherd His people, He was indirectly tasking them to feed His people with His word – heal their souls from the effects of sin – protect them from the danger of falling into Satan's traps. A famous theologian, Karl Rahner, rightly recalled, "It was usual in ancient times to call princes or kings (leaders of nations), the shepherds of their people. The image was perfectly intelligible to the people of that time. They pictured a person going before his flock, feeding... guiding...leading to pasture...defending...looking after them."

Going by this ancient tradition, it was, therefore, appropriate for Jesus to call himself, "The Good Shepherd" Who lays down His life for His sheep (John 10:14-15). As Christians, you and I are baptized into Christ, and are called to be imitators of the 'Good Shepherd" Who lays down His life for His sheep. Priests and other religious leaders are specially called by God to be good shepherds to the flocks God has entrusted into their pastoral care. Thus, like Christ, they should be always willing to sacrifice their pleasure and self for the good of the people they serve. We must forfeit our interests for that of God's people! As a parent in the family, you are called to be a good shepherd to your spouse, your kids and other members of your household. As a mother or a father; grandma or grandpa, you have a responsibility to feed them with God's word - keep them healthy in body and mind - keep them safe from the deceit of the Evil One in the form of modernization and materialism. As a principal or a teacher in the school, you have the duty to be a good shepherd to the children entrusted into your care and to the faculty and staff. As one in a leadership role, you have the duty to be a good shepherd to the people you serve.

As we reflect on the call to be "good shepherds," we must remember that today is also Vocation Sunday, thus we pray that young people of our parish may answer the call to offer themselves to serve God as priests and religious. We also pray for 29 of our children who are receiving Christ, the Good and Eternal Shepherd, as they make their First Holy Communion this Sunday. May the examples of their parents and this Faith Community always inspire these young ones and draw them closer to **Christ, the Good Shepherd**.


WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS
