Program Description

This program provides entry-level and upgrade training in kitchen cabinet/furniture construction and provides students with a broad-based set of skills that is required by the wood products manufacturing industry and is directly transferable to the manufacturing sector in general. Students are introduced to the valuable skills necessary for employment and post-secondary woodworking programs. The program also includes state-of-the-art cabinetmaking equipment in which students learn how to operate machines to perform the necessary tasks safely, efficiently, and with a high degree of quality. This program stresses safety and safe operating conditions will be reviewed. Students are provided training in cabinet and furniture construction skills for making traditional face frame and European (32 mm) cabinet systems including cabinet analysis and design with the development of process route sheets, estimating, and bill of materials commonly used in modern industry. Special emphasis is placed on specifications of state-of-the-art woodworking machinery and theory.

At the advanced level, students will have laboratory experiences using highperformance woodworking machines. They will perform individual machine set-ups and produce high-quality work.
