Burt and Elaine Taylor

Elaine was raised in a wonderful Christian family. Her dad came to the U.S. from the Netherlands when he was three and her mother's family shortly before she was born. Their families were friends



and her dad kidded about "robbing the cradle" - he was three years older. They married in 1924 and settled in Grand Rapids where her mother's father was a Sunday school teacher in a Christian Reformed Church (CRC).

He learned of the Grace message and left the CRC and went to the Berean Church in Grand Rapids.

In the 1930's, her parents moved to Holland and began attending the Berean Church. There were four children in Elaine's family; Julie, Bob, Shirley, and Elaine, the youngest. She was three



when Julie went to Milwaukee Bible Institute (now Grace Bible College) and Bob left for the Navy. Julie and Dr. Veltman's daughter, Jeanette, were the first women to graduate from Milwaukee Bible Institute. Julie would come home from Bible college, tell Elaine Bible stories and asked her if she would like to ask Jesus into her heart. She did at age four or five and can still remember it in the kitchen of her parents' home.

Elaine remembers Bible classes in the basement of the church with Dr Veltman and the old pump organ there. Since their families were neighbors with the pastors they were also friends and she remembers her mom talking to Millie Kramer (Pastor Clarence Kramer's wife) through the screen windows next door.

Burt was born and grew up in Cleveland, Ohio,

the fifth (and only boy) of six children. His family was active in a Baptist Church and he accepted

Super Seniors Visit the Ark

The flood in Noah's time and the Ark he constructed is a significant event as described in Genesis 6 - 8. Answers In Genesis (AIG), The organization

that built the Creation Museum in northern Kentucky and recently opened a full-size replica of Noah's Ark. AIG's Ark Encounter is located along I-75 in Kentucky a few miles south of Cincinnati. Like the Creation Museum, the Ark features world-class educational displays and presentations portraying details of the flood, construction of the ark and numerous other related Biblical events. Three Parkside Super Seniors joined the May 22 to 24 visit to the Ark Encounter and Creation Museum with a group of senior adults from South Church in Lansing.

Answers in Genesis is an apologetics ministry dedicated to assisting Christians in defending their faith and proclaiming the gospel of

Jesus Christ effectively. Their focus is on providing answers to questions surrounding the book of Genesis the most-attacked book of the Bible. They also seek to train others to develop a biblical world view, expose the bankruptcy of evolutionary ideas, and the philosophy that claims the earth is "millions of years old."

Book Review

Many people understand there are two creation accounts - the Bible and nature. These are sometimes referred to as the Special account (the Bible) and General account (nature). Throughout the Bible God is referred to as the Creator and the



first chapter of Genesis details the physical creation account. A major theme of the General account is recognizing "design" that can be clearly observed in every aspect of nature. Dr. Randy Guliuzza, with the Institute of Creation Research, has a nifty little book that explores the many topics of design in nature. *Clearly Seen, Constructing Solid Arguments for Design*,

Everyone can recognize design in nature - it is sim-



ply a matter of "common sense!" Many things were designed for a specific purpose - bird wings for flying and fish gills for breathing. Further more, it is obvious that everything that is intentionally built/created is designed by someone - there is intelligence involved. However, Evolution Theory claims that the design seen in nature is

only apparent! For instance, in biology natural selection (a non-directional, non-intelligent process) is credited for the design observed in living organisms.

In short chapters, Guliuzza examines the many aspects of design in nature and how they all bear witness to the design that God built into creation. Among the wide range of topics included are: how things fit together and function, complex design patterns seen in nature, life's microscopic machines, similarity of features for similar functions, design for a specific purpose, and more. Each chapter closes with two interesting and useful features - an example being discussed in the chapter and a set of questions (with the answers).

If you enjoy learning how nature has been created (designed), Guliuzza's insight into design abundantly displayed in the General account of creation should be interesting.
