# WE ARE THE CHURCH

Church Family,

As we move from a season of celebrating Christ's resurrection to a season looking at the development of the early church, I am reminded of the profound privilege we share in being members of the body of Christ. Our journey as a community of believers mirrors the spirit of the early church as depicted in the book of Acts, where unity, prayer, and mutual support were foundational to their faith.

In Acts 2:42, we read:

MATTHEW 28:6

We are called to follow the example set by Jesus Himself who came not to be served but to serve (Matthew 20:28). Whether through acts of kindness, acts of service, or acts of generosity, we demonstrate our love for each other and fulfill our calling as disciples of Christ.

### **Sharing of Gifts:**

We are urged to share the gifts bestowed upon us by God—our time, talents, and treasures—with one another. Each of us has been uniquely gifted by the Holy Spirit, and by sharing these gifts, we enrich the entire body of believers and glorify God. **Being a Witness:** Finally, our membership in the body of Christ empowers us to witness to the work and word of Jesus Christ in our lives and in the world around us. Through our words and actions, we proclaim the love and grace of our Savior, inviting others to experience the transformative power of His gospel.

Let us embrace our role as members of the body of Christ with joy and gratitude, following the example of the early church in devotion to prayer, service, fellowship, and witness. Especially in this season where we will be adding new members through both confession and confirmation! Together, let us continue to grow in faith and love, drawing ever closer to God and to one another.






### Firm Foundation Campaign

- \$50,000 starting funds for preservation and repair of Sanctuary Wing and Steeple (doors in the wings, brick work, water proofing, eavestroughs, flashing, etc)
- Cleaning, Organizing & Supplying Basement and Kitchen for ministry use

•Launching at least two smaller groups meeting monthly to improve church community and connection (one group for individuals/couples with children, one group for


individuals/couples without children). Training and equipping leaders to see these through.

If you're on a computer (or any device with an internet connection), you can easily give to your church by heading to <u>Tithe.ly/Give</u>. Once there, search for your church, and fill in the giving form.

### #3 - Give in App

Want to give to your church using the convenience of your smartphone? No problem! Download the Tithe.ly App from

the <u>App Store</u> (iPhone) or <u>Google Play Store</u> (Android). Once you've downloaded the app, create an account or log in, locate your church and tap "Give Now" to complete your contribution!

### **Drop Box Available**
