

Belonging to His Flock

The image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd is one of the loveliest images we have found of him. And we owe it to Jesus himself. This is how He described himself and his mission. Jesus is no hireling. The hireling doesn't own the sheep, and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf approaching. Jesus is the Good Shepherd. The sheep belong to Him, and He is ready to die for them. He made a wonderful promise to those who belong to Him. Firstly, He promised that none of them would be lost. No one would succeed in snatching from His care the sheep the Father has entrusted to Him. The sheep that belong to Him will be safe with Him. Secondly, He promised to lead them to the pastures of eternal life. The feeling of belonging to Jesus, and of being known and loved by Him, is enormously comforting and reassuring. He will take care of us in life and death. 'I give them eternal life... they will never be lost (eternally).'


But the relationship has to be a two-way thing. We have to choose to belong. But how can we tell if we truly belong to His flock? What does belonging entail? Essentially three things. The first and basic requirement is to believe in Him. We enter the flock by becoming believers. But belief is only the beginning. The second requirement is to listen to Him: 'My sheep listen to my voice.' To listen to His voice is to heed His teachings. and the third requirement is to follow Him: 'My sheep follow me.' To follow Him is to do His word.

If in the practical living out of our daily lives, we were in no way guided by the teaching of Jesus, how can we claim to belong to him? We should be happy to belong to Jesus. The opposite is more likely to be the case. Trials and sufferings are an opportunity to prove one's faith in, and obedience to, the Lord.

The flock is the image of community. Community is fundamental to Christianity. We can't belong to Jesus without belonging also to His flock. There are those who say: 'Why should I go to church? Why can't I just worship God in my own way? From earliest times, Christians came together in community, to witness to Jesus' resurrection, and to live by His teachings. They supported one another by praying and worshipping together, and a loving service of one another.

The ordinary person, lazy and self-centred, with more doubts than certainties, needs a community to keep him/her on track. For most Catholics, their faith is nourished at a local level. By belonging to a community, they are able to give support to one another. The Sunday observance has a crucial role to play. It is one of the essential elements that hold the Church (community) together. It is in this way that the members stay in contact with one another, and support one another. Without the Sunday observance all the support would evaporate.
