Hybrid Cacti of the Jarilla Mountains Otero Co., New Mexico Dr. Paul Hyder

Two species of cactus, the Claret Cup and the Texas Rainbow, hybridize in the Jarilla Mountains of south-central New Mexico. This talk covers the biology of these hybrids and examines the diversity of flower colors and spination of these plants.

Dr. Paul Hyder is a local ecologist/photographer/musician who, in addition to teaching Environmental Science and Physics at Eastwood High School, gives natural history based field trips and lectures to interested parties in the El Paso/Las Cruces area.



AT FEATHER LAKE

An intense mid-August storm flooded Feather Lake to a depth of 5.28 feet, its greatest depth since Sept. 19, 2014. The water receded gradually through late August and September, until less than 20% of the basin still held shallow water in late September. Then another storm hit, flooding the basin to a depth of 2.86 feet. For the first time since July-August 2010, we've had some water in the basin throughout 2 consecutive months!

The storm water, of course, brought with it a diverse mix of trash: a sofa, a door, many tires, countless beverage containers, and who knows what else. Our next workday at Feather Lake will be **Sat., October 7**, starting at **2 p.m.** With the basin now flooded, we'll have to leave the soggy trash for another day and work instead in the uplands.

Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.

Notes from the Field

Cloudcroft/Mescalero Field Trip, August 5, 2017

We visited the Mescalero Fish Hatchery, in Mescalero, NM, our first visit there. It had been very hot in El Paso and temperature there was a nice cool 62 degrees.

There is a nature trail, wetlands and a visitor center. The only fish raised there are trout. Along the creek trail there were lots of trees with berries and birds. Some of the birds were gorging themselves on the berries and would not even fly.



Scrub-Jay, and **Steller's Jay**. From the Hatchery we headed over to Cloudcroft. On the way, we saw **Western Bluebirds**. In Cloudcroft we ate lunch at the Trestle Picnic Area. We then went to Bluff Springs Waterfall where we saw **Dark-eyed Junco** and **Hermit Thrush** and headed back to El Paso.

Down the Valley Reservoirs, Saturday, August 19, 2017

We started at McNary and on the farms roads leading to the McNary Reservoir we saw **Lazuli Bunting**, **Cassin's Kingbird**, **Loggerhead Shrike**, **Barn Owl**, **American Kestrel**, **Red-tailed Hawk**, **Mississippi Kite**, **Great Egret**, **Snowy Egret**, **Great Blue Heron**, and **Greater Roadrunner**. The water at the reservoirs was very high, so there were very few shore birds, but we saw lots of **Clark's** and **Western grebes**. We also saw **Eared** and **Pied-billed grebes**, **Forster's Tern**, **Black Tern**, **American Avocet**, **Green Heron**, **Black-necked Stilts** and **Ruddy Duck**. The Tornillo and Ft. Hancock reservoirs had basically the same things we saw at McNary. A quick stop at Rio Bosque where we saw a pair of **White-tailed Kites** and

Western Wood-Pewee and **Burrowing Owl** and we headed home.



Percha Dam, Saturday, September 9, 2017

We got an early start and the morning was cool. The montane migration was evident. We saw six species of warblers - **Townsend's**, **MacGillivray's**, **Yellow**, **Lucy's**, **Wilson's**, and the best one - **American Redstart** female. There was such an infiltration of **Wilson's Warblers**, it seemed every tree had one or more. Other birds seen were **Warbling Vireo**, **Plumbeous Vireo**, **White-breasted Nuthatch**, **Western Tanager**, **Blue Grosbeak**, **Olive-sided Flycatcher**, **Vermilion Flycatcher** and **Western Wood-Pewee**. In the river we saw **Great Egrets**, **Great Blue Heron**, **Spotted Sandpiper** and a female **Common Merganser**. We also saw several raptors. We ate our

lunch there and headed back to El Paso.

We'll go to Dell City Valley to look for migrating shore birds, hawks and passerines. The last time we were there we got lots of birds.




Saturday, November 11, 2017 Ascarate Lake
